From her lips and from the scrolls of the prophets, He learned of heavenly things Since He gained knowledge as we may do, His intimate acquaintance with the Scriptures shows how diligently His early years were given to the study of God's word." (70)						
•	The strategic point: In the heat of spiritual battle and in the face of a nearly overpowering temptation, Jesus seizes a solitary strategy—He quotes Scripture.						
•	Or to put it another way: "Thy word have I in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee." Psalm 119:11
