SAVIOR SIBLINGS?

“Savior Siblings” was the newspaper headline. Molly Nash is sixteen years old now—and very much alive. But in 2000 the promise of any future at all was doubtful. Molly was born with a severe type of Fanconi anemia, “a blood disorder that almost always results in leukemia by the age of 10.” Her only hope a bone marrow transplant. And the optimal transplant donor needed to be a sibling with genetically identical tissue. But Molly was an only child. Until Dr. John Wagner—a bone marrow transplant expert at the University of Minnesota—suggested a brave, novel protocol. Would Molly’s parents be willing to undergo in-vitro (“test tube”) fertilization to create multiple embryos—with the hopes of finding one embryo *without* the genetic coding for Fanconi anemia?

After multiple rounds of in-vitro fertilization “and tens of thousands

of dollars borrowed from Jack's parents," at last a genetically "perfect" embryo was formed. Nine months later little Adam was born into the Nash family—and six weeks after that, Molly received her transplant from the blood in her baby brother's umbilical cord. Today ten years later she's the picture of health—and seemingly unimpressed with her "irritating little brother" who became a "savior sibling" in order to save her life. (SB Tribune 10-20-10)



Two reflections on this news piece. #1—*When something is truly worth it, you don't quit trying.* Jack and Lisa Nash, Molly's parents, apparently thought so. So they invested multiple attempts at tens of thousands of dollars in order for their prayers to be answered. Shouldn't we do the same? For 53 days now we've been asking God to revive our hearts and church and school, and to save our lost friends and family. Shall we quit now? Hardly! Jesus' command to "ask for the Holy Spirit" (Luke 11:9, 13) literally means "to keep on asking." And keep on we must! Beginning next week, the opening page of our worship bulletin-booklet will feature fresh ways we can keep on asking. After all, isn't the promised answer worth it?

#2—*Our Creator became our Savior Sibling.* On this Creation Celebration Sabbath we remember that the Creator of this universe was born in a manger to become our Elder Brother. **"In these last days [God]**

has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. . . . For this reason he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that . . . he might make atonement for the sins of the people"

(Hebrews 1:2; 2:17 NIV). No wonder our Creator is twice worthy of our worship—first he made us, and then he saved us. With our Savior our Sibling, is it any wonder we must never quit praying now?

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE \ HELP IN TIME OF NEED



Sometimes the unexpected happens. It may be a medical emergency for someone in the family. Or the vehicle used by the family breadwinner suddenly goes dead. The circumstance puts the family in crisis. A total of 49 families in similar situations were helped so far this year from PMC's Emergency Assistance Fund in the dollar amount of \$22,097. Each application for aid was carefully screened by a volunteer social worker. Applicants must be either members of Pioneer Memorial Church or referred by one of our members.

The main purpose of our emergency aid fund is to meet survival needs like shelter resulting from

some short-term or temporary problem. We do not give cash and if food is needed, we work with local community agencies like Neighbor to Neighbor and God's Abundant Pantry to provide it. The program does not help with rent before or when it is due.

Assistance with rent is only available in a crisis, to prevent eviction or homelessness.

Recently the church received a note of thanks from a grateful recipient. "Thank you for your support and prayers and your gracious contribution towards my living expense during this difficult time. Many blessings to you and may Heaven sustain your powerful ministry to those in need."

Currently we are looking for a volunteer with a background in social work to lead in this ministry. If you are interested in serving, please contact the church.

Then the LORD answered Job out of the storm. He said: "Who is this that darkens my counsel with words without knowledge? Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me.

"Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation? Tell me, if you understand. Who marked off its dimensions? Surely you know! Who stretched a measuring line across it?"

"On what were its footings set, or who laid its cornerstone—while the morning stars sang together and all the angels shouted for joy?"

MUSIC ALIVE

Creation sparkles and glows in today's Hymn of Praise. We reflect on God's creatorship with a hymn about the resplendent beauty of His creation, "All Things Bright and Beautiful." Irish author Cecil Alexander (1818-1895) wished that children would understand the beliefs stated in the catechism, so in children's hymns she rephrased and amplified various beliefs. The particular subject of this hymn is, "I believe in

God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth." Things small (st. 1) and large (st. 2), atmospheric conditions and garden fruits (st. 3), join the grand testimony to the Creator, "Who has made all things well" (st. 4). This grand hymn text is set to an English traditional melody, picturesquely named ROYAL OAK, the melody's very name furthering the imagery of creation's wonders.
