THE ABC'S OF BIBLE PRAYER *Katrina Blue*

When one of my houseplants starts to wilt it usually means that I have not been giving it enough attention. The only thing it needs is very simple, water. But it can't water itself. I need to fill the jug, walk over to the plant and pour it in so that the water soaks down deep into the roots. Then the plant begins to revive. When plants are not cared for, they have a tendency, well to die.

The same is true of our spiritual lives. If I don't make a conscious effort to spend time with God each day my relationship with Him can start to fade. I could throw my hands up in the air and say in defense that my relationship with Jesus is after all, long distance anyway! What's the difference?

There's a lot of difference. First, God wants to have an intimate relationship with each of us. But if we don't take care and pay attention we can miss out on the blessing. If we switch off or tune out on a conversation with our spouse or a friend, we are no longer having meaningful contact. What can happen is that the other person gets upset with us for not listening.

A repeated point of hurt in the book of Jeremiah is God's complaint that "no one listens to Me." (Jer 16:12b) In fact, God said to Jeremiah that He had been "rising early and exhorting, saying, "Obey My voice."" (Jer 11:7b) I can do the same to God today by not reading His

Word or not spending time in prayer talking with Him.

Jesus told a story about Himself calling His followers when He told the Pharisees that He was the Good Shepherd. Not only did He say that He would call His sheep by name and lead them out but that the sheep would follow

MASTER PLAN OF EVANGELISM

MICHIGAN CITY \ EVANGELISTIC INITIATIVE

Approximately 20 AU students and faculty head to Michigan City at 9:15 a.m. each Sabbath for a full day of worship and door to door work as part of the Michigan City Evangelistic Initiative sponsored in part by PMC's Master Plan of Evangelism.

This fall they participated as support personnel in Michigan City's first public evangelistic campaign in 26 years! Thirty to forty attended the meetings with new interests identified and several decisions made. In January, 2011, AU students will conduct their own Prophecy Seminar, and in March they will conduct their own evangelistic series in the same public school auditorium where this fall's evangelistic series was held.

Planning for this year-long evangelistic outreach to Michigan City began last spring by the AU Religion Dept and representatives of the two small Adventist churches in Michigan City. Besides PMC and the AU Religion Dept, supporters of this effort include the Lake Union Conference, the Lake Region Conference, the Indiana Conference and the Michigan Conference. What shall we say about a culture that names the Friday after Thanksgiving—the Friday this year that found stores opening their doors to frenzied Christmas shoppers at 2 a.m., 3 a.m., 4 a.m., or stayed open all night—“Black Friday”? The day after we have theoretically thanked God for another year of divine benediction is *black* Friday? Early estimates for Black Friday purchases by Americans this year are \$10.69 billion. (One hundred of those Black Fridays and we could pay off the nation's \$1.3 trillion budget deficit!) And as if Black Friday weren't enough, Cyber Monday this week netted an estimated \$1.023 billion of on-line Christmas sales, setting a new one-day record for cyberspace spending.

“And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn” (Luke 2:7).

Is it too late to celebrate a counter-cultural Christmas this year? To radically simplify our gift-giving? To inform our loved ones that this year a gift to charity in our names would be very special indeed (our church staff is trying that for the second time this year)? I'm not

wanting to become the Grinch who stole Christmas—but I am asking myself if maybe the silver light of this season's Narrative is utterly anti-commercial, counter-materialism—and that maybe there are more meaningful ways to commemorate His birth.

What if you gave Christ as a gift this year? Amazon.com carries a new edition of an old classic for \$2.99! A friend sent me this new edition earlier this year, and I read it through over the summer. Gone are the old King James quotations. Replaced now with NKJV and even NIV in places, this new paperback edition of *The Desire of Ages* is a keeper.

Go online and check it out for yourself. For \$2.99 you could buy a dozen of them for your dearest family and friends. I promise you that this fresh new NKJV edi-

tion makes this magnum opus of Ellen White's a heart-stirring read. It's my favorite book. In it you'll meet the counter-cultural Jesus as you never have before. What a Savior and Friend! Share him with your world. And let Christmas this year truly be about the Gift “my True Love gave to me.”

MUSIC ALIVE

CAROL OF THE DRUM

“Carol of the Drum”, played today by the AU Wind Symphony, is a colorful carol about giving for the Christ child. According to one interpretive note, the lyrics “tell of a poor young boy who, unable to afford a gift for the infant Jesus, plays his drum for the newborn...” Composer Katherine K. Davis was a midwesterner, born in Missouri in 1892. However, she was a graduate of Wellesley

College in Massachusetts. Many of her compositions, more than 600 in total, are choral. (A widely-known lyric by Davis is that of “Let All Things Now Living”, as sung two weeks ago in PMC’s A Feast of Hymns.) Katherine K. Davis continued to compose into her eighties, when failing eyesight occasioned the end of her composition. She is buried in Concord, Massachusetts.
