

# IOWA, NEW HAMPSHIRE AND THE END OF THE WORLD

ook, I'm not suggesting that the just concluded lowa caucuses and the upcoming New Hampshire primary are strategic pieces in some sort of apocalyptic end game. But I would invite you to ponder the power of the press and/or paid political ads.

Even the talking heads within the beltway of the nation's capital this past week have been chattering in amazement over the swift collapse one candidate's heretofore anticipated victory in lowa's caucuses. Riding high in the pre-caucus polls, the candidate's sudden tumble from prominence has been attributed by most news media commentators to the power of negative political advertising, financed by political action committees (so called "super PACs"). The \$2.8+ million that these technically "independent" super PACs

invested in lowa alone are evidence enough of the power of negative advertising. I.e., it works!

What's that have to do with the rest of us who will never touch \$2.8 million in our life time? Stepping away from political allegiances or nuances, it does make you wonder, doesn't it, how fickle we the public are, if three-weeks of non-stop television and radio ads can actually change our minds? Never mind those who justify this gushing of advertising dollars into a relatively, politically inconsequential rural state. It still makes me wonder how easily swayable we Americans are to the power of the media, the press, the advertising agencies.

Which being interpreted means, I wonder if, in a time of crisis or critical decision-making, a relatively small cabal of individuals—with the financial horsepower to back themselves—could sway an entire nation to pursue a particular course or come to a particular decision. I wonder if the American public (perhaps even the global public) could be as easily persuaded as the lowans were. Include some momentous catastrophe (financial, natural, political) and it wouldn't take much to "guide" the public to a desired outcome, would it?

For all our crowing about the independent American spirit, the truth is that a stadium full of screaming fans can pretty much set the agenda for an entire city, can't they?

Apparently the Apocalypse thinks so. In no uncertain terms Revelation 13 describes "all the world" (v 3) being led


down the primrose path of disaster. Which is why I love the corollary narrative in Daniel—the compelling story about three young politicos who refused to yield to the full-court press of the press and the government. The entire nation (as it were) bowed down to the king's golden image—but not Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego: "Our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and He will deliver us from vour hand, O king. But if not, let it be known to you, O king, that we do not serve your gods, nor will we worship the gold image which you have set up" (Daniel 3:17, 18). I.e., we will not be bought or persuaded away from our allegiance to the Creator.

God give us that threesome generation when we will need it! But in the meantime, the next time the press or the super PACs attempt to persuade you in 60 seconds what to think or do, do the Shadrach thing and simply refuse. Your allegiance to God in the New Year isn't for sale, no matter when the world ends.

# **CHRISTIAN** EDUCATION

#### **ANDREWS ACADEMY / THE PENNY WAR**

This year's theme for Andrew Academy's NHS Cause Week was "Ally Against Anger: Stop Violence." Members of the National Honor Society recognize the tragedy violence has on the world, country, and their community and because of this, they challenged their peers and community to join them in raising awareness to defeat the culture of violence.

Various quest lecturers discussed various topics on this theme. example Joelle Ashley, an Andrews Academy alumnus, spoke about violence in global terms, pointing out that violence on such a scale is by design: Satan's design. The desensitization of our world regarding violence works against God's plan to sensitize us to Jesus' sacrifice on the cross to reconcile us to Himself. NHS members choose Alendu Village Mission in Kenya as their fundraising project for Cause Week. Ms. Ashley quoted some of the regional statistics on sexual, physical and emotional violence there. She explained that Alendu Village Mission works within their community center and with local

residents to create a safer, healthier, more self-sustaining environment for the orphans and widows that are fed and cared for by the project.

The students rallied together for this project by conducting a "Penny War" with a twist. Each grade level competed to load up their class' coin repository pennies and dollars while dumping as many nickels, dimes and quarters into other class' containers. The "winning" class total was calculated by adding up all the pennies and bills and then subtracting the amount of money in silver that has been added by rival classes. The seniors won the penny war, Academy students collectively raised \$ 1,387.72! The Alendu Village Mission will be blessed with this money to help create a safer, healthier, more self-sustaining environment for the orphans and widows that are fed and cared for by this project.

#### **MEDIA MINISTRY** / WEB REPORT

As this new year begins we have every reason to be thankful for what God has been doing through our web ministry. In 2011, www.pmchurch. tv had 96,608 unique visitors from 190 countries around the globe. Our live web streaming viewership Saturday morning has increased from 99 viewers when we started January 1, 2011 to a peak of 422 people and we expect this to continue to growing over the next few years. 110,000 sermons were downloaded by people going directly to our website in addition to the 6,000 podcast subscribers that receive the sermon automatically each week. And 37,534 study guides were downloaded as well.






