





When I fell in love with Karen, before I'd even gotten to know her, it was the utter preoccupation of my teenage heart to get her attention. I knew each day that as I headed for the cafeteria at SMC ("Southern Matrimonial College"), she'd be coming out of one of her nursing classes and I could pass her on

the sidewalk. And so every day, in one of those foolish (but effective) teenage rituals, I'd drop my head when I spotted her and pretend to be deep in thought while staring at the sidewalk in front of me, but all the while maneuvering my steps so that I would practically run straight into her. Then there'd be the burst of laughter, the quick apology about "not" seeing her there, and with her face fresh in mind I'd be on my way. Who can know "the way of a man with a maiden" (Proverbs 30:19 NIV)?

But then, the ways of Love divine are as inexplicable at times, aren't they? Explain to the rest of us, please, the compelling passion that drives a God from his great white throne to our dark, fallen earth, all for what? That we might be granted the chance to cry at the top of our

TAKE MY HAND

Precious Lord, Take My Hand" stems from a real-life tragedy. Growing up in Georgia as a minister's son, Thomas Dorsey later drifted away from God. But through seemingly miraculous sparing in scrapes with death, he returned to his religious roots. Once during a revival meeting in St. Louis, a telegram informed him that his wife and newborn son had both died. In his grief, he said, "God, you aren't worth

a dime to me right now!" But a few weeks later Dorsey created "Precious Lord," including its memorable lines "through the storm, through the night." The following Sunday the choir sang it, fitted as it was to a familiar tune, at Ebenezer Baptist Church in South Chicago. Dorsey once said, "I try to lift [people's] spirits and let them know that God still loves them."

SPIRITUAL PARENTING

WORSHIPING GOD AT CHURCH WITH YOUR KIDS

Worshiping God at church with your kids in tow is definitely challenging. Have you ever been tempted to say, "It's not worth it - we'll just listen on the radio or watch service on live stream or on TV"? Re-

ject that thought and ask God to help you. It's definitely worth it in the long haul, even though each week may be a struggle just to get there.

Why do Adventists encourage families to take their kids to church? So children, from infancy, can experience something of the awe of the

Divine and the presence of the Holy Spirit; so children will gradually learn what worship means and how to worship God at church; so the experience of worshiping God at church will become an indispensable part of a child's spiritual self; and so families can worship God together.

How can you help your children learn to worship God at church joyfully and eagerly each week?

Be prepared. During the week prepare your "church tote". Into the tote stash away a few interesting, noiseless, and spiritually focused (if possible) things to help church be more interesting for your child. Don't let your child see any of these things during the week. They are special for church.

For babies and toddlers, include a soft cuddly toy animal, a chewing ring, a cloth picture book about a religious topic, a cloth handkerchief, and a receiving blanket. Don't put these things in a diaper bag, but use a special tote for Sabbath. Then it's ready to just grab as you leave for church.

For older preschoolers, put in a

Sabbath picture book, perhaps crayons and a religious coloring book, a cloth handkerchief, and maybe a small doll or animal or a very small felt board and some felt objects. Everything should be noiseless.

Always remember the goal: To help your child experience God and the Holy

Spirit at church so she becomes an active participant in the worship service.

Be sure your little child gets some active time and a snack (if needed) before going into church. It's part of being prepared. Pick up a churchtime bag of activities at the Children's Lending Library at the Visitor's Desk in the front foyer of the church or a children's bulletin with religious penand-pencil activities at any entrance. There's one for younger children and one for older kids.

Be engaged. Take advantage of every opportunity to get your child engaged in the church service. Most kids experience the awesomeness of God and a sense of reverence through the music at church. Many Toddlers and Two's are attracted to the organ, the singing, and the other musical instruments. They'll stand up, pay at-

tention, and even sway to the music. Encourage Mr. Four and Miss Five to sing the songs and hymns. Point to each word in the hymnal as you sing. Soon they will learn the tunes and sing praises to God.

Help your child collect the children's offering. Be part of the children's story. Kneel or stand to pray. Stand to sing (or be held in your arms.) Put in his own offering. Find Bible verses in her own Bible, or help you find the verse in your Bible while cuddling on your lap. It's important to make this connection with the Bible.

Miss Five can also begin to listen to the sermon. Select a key word the pastor probably will say many times during the sermon. Print it at the top of a piece of paper and give Miss Five a fat pencil so she can make a mark every time the minister says this key word. Soon she will learn to listen.

If there is nothing going on that your child can be engaged in, then bring out only one of the objects in your tote or church-time bag, or a children's bulletin. Never bring out everything at once. This creates restlessness and a "this-is-play-time" attitude.

Next time we'll continue with more ideas for worshiping God at church. In the meantime, get your Sabbath tote bag ready, be prepared and be engaged.






