HOH / TAKING KIDS ZONE TO THE SIDEWALK!

“Pastor Paul, we wanna join your team!” said four Benton Harbor youth looking to volunteer after one of our first Sidewalk Kids Zone (SKZ) programs. This week Pastor Walter overheard two of these boys bragging about how ‘hard’ [aka cool] the SKZ van was and that they were both ‘on staff!’ Benton Harbor has opened its arms to allow Kids Zone to go mobile in parks, housing projects and sidewalks. Thanks to a generous donation to purchase the mobile SKZ van and dedicated volunteers, we have reached 245 kids at 6 different sites.

Our mission is to reach families by reaching children and teens. With SKZ we reach 3x the kids and more parents for less than 1/2 the cost and 1/3 the volunteers compared with our normal “buses and building” program. We need the “buses and building” program for winter but SKZ is perfect for summer. SKZ is the ‘best bang for the buck’ kids outreach I have seen and it will be central to our future success. Like the rest of our ministry, SKZ would not be possible without your prayers and generosity. Thank you. Together, we are making a difference.

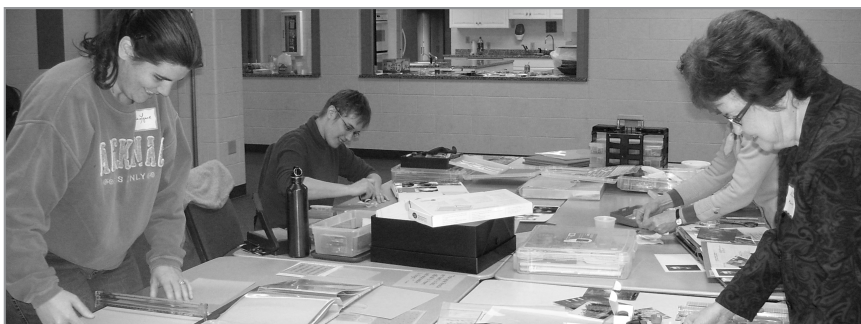
SCRAPBOOKING MINISTRY / A PLACE FOR CREATIVITY

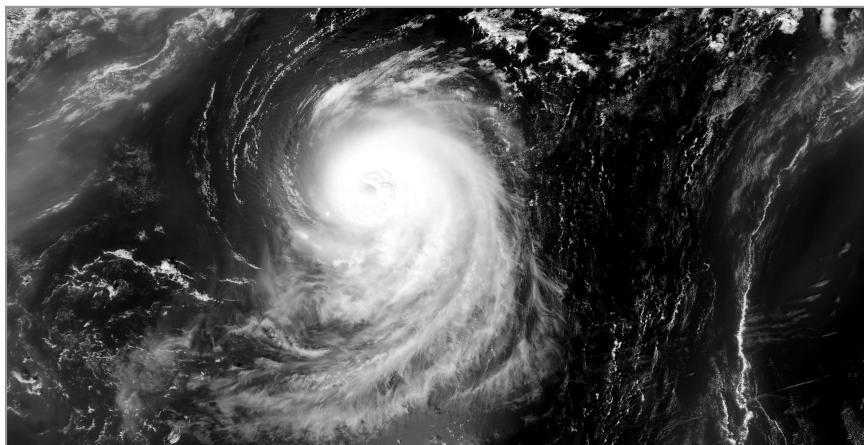

the most ravaging drought in its long history. Ah, the weather and quakes—Mother Nature keeps changing the subject, doesn't she?

“All Creatures of Our God and King” (hymn no. 2) contains words paraphrased from Francis of Assisi’s original text. Francis was born into a wealthy Italian family, but while young he renounced worldly wealth and embraced voluntary poverty. Regarding “All Creatures”, one commentator notes, “Francis of Assisi’s love for all nature is beautifully set forth . . . In 1225, very ill and temporarily blind, Francis

took refuge from the summer heat in a straw hut at San Damiano. His discomfort was increased by a swarm of field mice which also occupied the hut. Under these circumstances he wrote this magnificent lauda . . . praising God for all his creatures.” Today’s offertory is based on a melody commonly associated with this text but versatile in serving other texts, too.
