## HEALTH TENT / A NEW EXPERIENCE

airgoers at the 2011 Berrien County Youth Fair (BCYF) had a surprise this vear. Strolling past the Health Tent as they do every year, they were greeted by the same banner and signs as in vears past. However, a closer look at the goings-on inside revealed new things. Exercise equipment, including an elliptical, exercise bike, dumbbells, and exercise mats and balls, adorned the interior. Those who stepped in the big vellow-and-white tent were welcomed to have their blood pressure taken, receive one-on-one exercise training, try out various exercise challenges to determine their fitness, ask a dietitian food-related questions, share a prayer



request, receive a free massage, and take home information about healthrelated programs at Pioneer Memorial Church. The Health Tent is one of the longest-standing exhibits at the BCYF, and this year's theme was EXERCISE. With the goal of promoting an active, healthy lifestyle, approximately 200 volunteers from local SDA churches happily provided exercise routines, demonstrated exercise techniques, and cheered on the visitors who completed exercise challenges. Large groups of young people routinely converged on the tent to participate in its activities. creating a fun and lively environment that attracted even more visitors!

Visitors (including children) completed a fitness report card after visiting the various stations in the tent. The Health Tent generated a lot of interest among community members, some of whom have already started participating in PMC's health activities. The Health Tent provided a happy, healthy witness to more than 3,000 people this year, and the interest it generated continues to feed PMC's ongoing health programs.

JOHN 1:40-45, NIV

Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus.

The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, "We have found the Messiah" (that is, the Christ).

The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee. Finding Philip, he said to him, "Follow me."

Philip, like Andrew and Peter, was from the town of Bethsaida. Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

# CALLING AND CALLED

Today's worship journey mingles the motifs of God's call to discipleship and one's call to God. The introit is "Jesus Calls Us", associated with a moving text by Cecil Frances Alexander (hymn 285). Alexander had a strong vision to teach the young through her texts, which include "All Things Bright and Beautiful". In the postlude, the believer's call to God to come is expressed as in vibrant fall hues of orange, red and yellow. In the first section the melody is on top, with energized motifs like tongues of the Spirit's fire lapping up from underneath. The last section features majestic, smoother motifs, perhaps more indicative of the Father and the Creator. Speculatively, Bach intentionally included his own last name, in musical letters in order, at the end of this stirring music.






