THE GOD WHO INVESTS IN THE BANKRUPT

ust recently, what has been one J of the highest IPOs in history has had a rather shaky beginning. But if you look back to just over a year ago, you would have never guessed it. At the start of 2011, powerhouse firm Goldman Sachs invested \$450 million into then privately owned Facebook, giving it a valuation of about \$50 million. weeks later, General Atlantic, a \$17 billion investment firm, also took a relatively small piece of the pie, at a rate that would value the company at about \$65 billion. That translates into a 30% growth in under one financial quarter. WOW!

Now within a week of the historic IPO with a valuation of over \$100 billion, its also making new history by losing nearly 30% of its value. That leaves Mark Zuckerburg,

BH SOUP KITCHEN / SERVING THE HUNGRY

Ours is an increasingly passive society, where any kind of activity, whether work or play, can be transformed into a spectator sport.

This is even true of cooking, or rather "food preparation." Once considered typical of daily drudgery, it's become the stuff of neargladiatorial competition. We watch on television as would be master chefs and aspiring restaurateurs compete against circumstance and each other to put food on the table. On our side of the screen we can neither taste nor smell the various concoctions, and given the "exotic" nature of some of the ingredients, it may be just as well.

For others, however, the contest of putting a meal on the table is far more basic. For them, the biggest obstacle to overcome is being able to afford even the basic ingredients, never mind the unusual. This isn't a condition set in order to make a game more interesting and appealing. It is, rather, a chronic condition of a state of poverty too many of us choose to ignore. We

simply change the channel.

The Benton Harbor Soup Kitchen, serving an economically depressed community close by this university and its church, is one of the ministries of Pioneer Memorial Church. Its mandate is a simple one, taken from the teaching of Jesus: to serve the hungry by feeding them is to serve our Lord. This may not have the glamour of competition cookery, but in the eyes of Heaven, everybody wins.

But it doesn't yet earn enough money to justify its current value.

All through out the Bible people have placed value on different things without really accounting for the costs. Adam and Eve thought that a knowledge of good and evil was more valuable then obedience to God. Joseph's brothers thought getting rid of their brother was more valuable then their father's happiness. Israel thought it was more valuable to have a king lead them then the King of Kings. David cherished a fleeting moment with a beautiful woman more than having moral authority in his family. The rich man treasured his money coffers more then helping the poor. Ananias didn't value his word enough to give it all to mission. And this list could go on. Story after story, people giving more value to the wrong things without accounting for the bigger picture of eternity.

On the other hand, story after story, God pours more and more of

MUSIC ALIVE

LOVE CELEBRATED

God's love for humankind is a theme appearing frequently in hymns by Charles Wesley (1707-1788), perhaps nowhere more powerfully than in "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling." The imagery of this vivid hymn seems transcendent, yet somehow personal. It is a poetic celebration of God's seeking in love the redemption of fallen humanity. One commentary states that "Wesley had a gift for writing poetry; he

wrote verse continually, his letters often being in rhyme. . . ." He was a most prolific hymn writer, credited with more than 6,500 hymns. Wesley approached hymn subjects from a standpoint that transcended objectivity to embrace personal feeling. His hymns "appealed to the spiritually starved people who, under the preaching of the Wesley brothers [John and Charles], found renewed life, hope, and faith in the Scriptures."






