HOW DOES GOD STOMACH THE HEADLINES?

et's see—at the time of this writing the Cubs are down 0-3, Vladimir Putin ■ and Barrack Obama have flying aces bumping into each other over Syria, down on the ground Palestinians and Israelis are at it once again, half a world away North and South Korean families are reunited after being separated for 65 years since the Korean War, Wall Street is keeping its fingers crossed about any significant upsurge in the stock market before the end of the year, the latest rumor for the Vatican to squash is about the Pope having a small brain tumor, though the press has tired of reporting the immigration hemorrhage into Europe from the Middle East it still flows unabated, autumn is turning glorious here in the St. Joseph River valley, and did I mention the Cubs?

Life is filled with stuff we simply get used to, isn't it? And when a little four-year-old girl is caught in the deadly cross-fire of two cars dueling it out in a tragic case of road rage in Albuquerque, we pause, catch our breath over the stab of sorrow for so short a life snuffed out so insanely. And we go on. Because life does just that. Goes on.

Makes you wonder, doesn't it? How does God handle the headlines? Think



about it—He's the only One in the universe that has to live with them all, all the time, night and day, forever now it seems (to us at least). Poor God. How sad He can't quietly dismiss or callously forget the way we humans do. Instead He remembers. It all. All the time.

And what's even more astonishing is that God not only monitors *our* stories, He monitors the story of every life form that exists. "Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies?" Jesus asked. "Yet not one of them is forgotten by God" (Luke 12:6). And not only does He monitor, He cares.



"Yet not one of [those sparrows] will fall to the ground outside your Father's care" (Matthew 10:29).

In John Peckham's very new book (Peckham teaches at the theological seminary here at Andrews University), The Love of God: A Canonical Model (InterVarsity Press), he offers up this lengthy definition of God's love: "At the risk of oversimplification, God's love is virtuous, kind, generous, unmerited, voluntary, faithfully devoted, evaluative, profoundly affectionate and compassionate, intensely passionate, patient and longsuffering, mer-

ciful, gracious, just, steadfast, amazingly reliable and enduring but not unalterably constant, preferential but not arbitrarily exclusive, relationally responsive, desirous of reciprocation, and active" (65).

It takes a lot of words to define the love that courses through the heart of the Creator of this universe, doesn't it? A universe, and particularly a planet now held hostage by a sin-crazed rebel angel. Whose insane hatred of all that is divine or even reflective of the divine spews forth the headlines we've grown dangerously accustomed to of late. Even in Lucifer's backyard, God is still love.

IT TAKES A LOT OF WORDS TO DEFINE THE LOVE THAT COURSES THROUGH THE HEART OF THE CREATOR OF THIS UNIVERSE, DOESN'T IT?

Which means that "not a sigh is breathed, not a pain felt, not a grief pierces the soul, but the throb vibrates to the Father's heart" (Desire of Ages 356).


Or as the ancient prophet expressed it, "In all our affliction He is afflicted" (see Isaiah 63:9). Love feels the pain.

Divine love. As Peckham described it, "profoundly affectionate and compassionate, intensely passionate, patient and longsuffering . . . and active." God's love. For you. For me. For Putin and Obama. For the reunited families. For the four-year-old's heart-broken parents. For disappointed Cub fans. For the tiny brown sparrows.

"God is love" (1 John 4:8).

Turns out it's the only headline that lasts. \blacksquare

s Christians, God calls us to be good stewards of the earth and the things He has given us. Throughout the Bible God gives us divine principles on how to best live our lives as witnesses and stewards for Him. Both budgeting and stewardship are lessons that God wants us to learn and He outlines several principles in the Bible for us.

GOD PROVIDES IT ALL

The first and most important principle to remember when dealing with budgeting and stewardship is that everything that we have comes from God. Keeping this in mind will hold us back from spending money unnecessarily. God gives us the strength and intelligence to work and support ourselves and provide for our families.

"And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:19 NIV).

We might be tempted to think that we are the ones who provide for ourselves, but in truth everything that we have comes directly from above. This is a good principle to keep in mind when things get rough. Prayer is the answer when we are in need; God will provide what we need according to His will.

GIVE TO OTHERS

"Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you" (Luke 6:38 NIV).

The act of giving not only benefits the receiver but the giver as well. God doesn't need our money, but through our giving He blesses us. By putting God first on our budgets, we learn to respect His sovereignty and share our blessings with others.

SAVE A LITTLE

Even though we are to trust God to provide for us and to meet our needs, the Bible still communicates the wisdom of saving. God will provide for our every need; however, God wants us to understand the responsibility of saving for a rainy day.

"The wise store up choice food and olive oil, but fools gulp theirs down" (Proverbs 21:20 NIV).

From this we can conclude that God is showing us the importance of self-control and moderation. Sometimes it is better to save money for later rather than using it for something that is not necessarily needed.

STAY AWAY FROM DEBT

"The rich rule over the poor, and the borrower is slave to the lender" (Proverbs 22:7).

Avoid the debt trap! Taking on financial obligations for things that are not necessary is to be a bad steward of what God gives us. Once a person goes into debt, they lose a portion of their financial freedom. Staying out of debt allows us to exercise our faith in God. Sometimes, we as Christians use debts as a way of covering our perceived needs, instead of trusting in God to take care of our real needs.

As with anything else, when deciding to live according to God's stewardship principles, remember to keep Him first in your life. Seek out God's will in prayer and in studying the Bible. God cares about every aspect of your life and He will provide for your every need.

ess than 90 days ago God's Abundant Pantry needed \$15,000 to replace our worn-out van. This need was shared and an appeal made in early August. Many people who recognized the value of this ministry were moved to donate to the GAP Van Fund.

Today we are pleased to announce our goal was not only reached but exceeded. These donations have been used to purchase a 2006, Ford F-450 with a V-10 gasoline engine. This truck was put into service October 6 picking up 2,997 pounds of food from a regional food bank.

After research on the various types and models of vans and box trucks, we determined a low-profile moving truck with a ramp would serve our needs best. The best source for this style of used box trucks is U-Haul. We evaluated all the U-Haul rental trucks for sale in the Michiana area, test driving several, and we finally decided on one. The cost of

this truck with fees came to \$12,179. The donations purchased this truck, and the balance has been placed in a GAP Van Depreciation Fund.

Andrews University's international and graduate students served by God's Abundant Pantry personally experience the generous blessings of God that flow through people like you. The supplemental food provided fills the gap in their food budget.




