wenty years before God's Abundant Pantry came into existence, Dr. Tricket, Business Professor at Andrews University, recognized that many International students and their families were struggling financially, some even suffering from hunger and malnutrition.

Dr. Tricket addressed this need by cultivating sources of food that could be distributed to those in need. He used his car to haul the food that he distributed daily from his trunk to waiting students gathered under a tree come rain, shine, or snow.

Over the years Dr. Tricket's ministry grew to the point that a borrowed van was needed to transport the food. The owner of the van, a local business man, eventually dedicated his van to this ministry, even paying the cost of insurance, licensing, maintenance and repairs.

Last year the business man retired and now it is also time to retire the 1996 van which has logged over 210,000 miles. Without a dependable van to transport food, God's Abundant Pantry cannot function.

Over these three-plus decades, PMC members have faithfully donated the funds needed to supply the supplemental food distributed to qualified International/graduate students every Tuesday and Thursday.



Today a special offering of \$15,000 is needed to purchase a dependable van. Two gifts of \$1,000 each have already been received plus several smaller donations from people who recognize and appreciate the role and value that God's Abundant Panty plays in these students' lives.

ast Sabbath afternoon I went hiking with my cousin Lisa. As we plunged into the woods, I glanced in awe at the rays of light filtering through the trees. My sunglasses gave everything a yellow tint, highlighting leaves and sunshine. Enthralled, I stopped looking at where I was going until Lisa whispered, "Psst! Look!"

I turned and followed her pointing finger to the top of an oak tree. There, forty feet

above the ground, three fluffy brownish fur balls precariously waddled down the tree trunk. 'Baby bears' was my first thought, since the fur balls confidently ventured into broad daylight. But no, these animals had bushy tails

with black and white stripes, and black markings around their eyes. Baby raccoons!

The adolescent raccoons scrambled to keep steady footholds as they slowly descended the tree. But they weren't very good at climbing. They continuously bumped each other, crawled over each other, stopped, and changed directions. Lisa and I alternated between giggling at their antics and trying to capture their cuteness on camera.

After watching the baby raccoons for a while, we continued on our hike, and God's nature continued to surprise and delight us. We saw fossils of shells embedded in a rock, sparkling sunlight reflecting off the surface of the river, a cardinal singing his heart out, pudgy frogs smaller than your pinky fingernail hopping across the trail, a patch of brilliant orange mushrooms, two young buck deer munching tender grass, and vibrant butterflies and flowers.

Each time one of us happened upon one of these natural treasures, one of us would say, "Psst! Look!" Looking and seeing are pivotal to our lives. As Ralph Waldo Emerson said, "Never lose an opportunity of seeing anything beautiful, for beauty is God's handwriting."

Lisa and I would have had a much different experience if we had not noticed what was around us. We might have

thought we were the only living creatures in the woods if we had not seen the animals. We might have thought the forest was monochromatic if we had not seen the mushrooms and the flowers. We might have thought the

forest was young if we had not seen the enormous trees or the fossils. The way we perceived and interacted with the world was shaped by what we saw.

This same principle can be applied to other areas in our lives. We can serve others when we recognize their need. We can love others when we focus on how precious they are to Jesus. We can live in joyful gratitude when we are cognizant of God's blessings. What captures our attention captures our soul. For this reason, Paul wrote, "Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith" (Hebrews 12:1-2).

hill stands in County Meath, Ireland, bearing the name "Slane." This hill is approximately ten miles from the site where the religious leader known as St. Patrick is believed to have challenged King Loegaire by lighting an Easter Eve fire. It is this hill that occasions the unusual hymn tune name SLANE found at hymn no. 547. This melody, in its whole and fragmentarily, was heard

repeatedly at the just-concluded General Conference Session, enjoining attendees to pursue God's vision. The text, originally in Irish, was translated into English at the turn of the twentieth century. It is typically Irish in its very wide vocal range. These words ally themselves with the thought of Proverbs 29:18: "Where there is no vision, the people perish."

MASTER PLAN OF EVANGELISM








