“GRAMMER SLAMMERS”

HOW YOU SPELL REFLECTS ON WHOM YOU FOLLOW?

After a week of headline heartaches from the mass shooting in Roseburg to the biblical proportion flooding in South Carolina, here's a headline hardly as ponderous. According to USA TODAY the grammar-checking app Grammarly has run some numbers on the presidential candidates from both parties and their supporters who comment on the candidate's Facebook page. In short Grammarly set out to find out which candidate's supporters were the most grammatically correct. I.e., how many spelling and/or grammatical errors appear in the online postings of the various candidates' supporters.

How did Grammarly come up with its numbers? "A sample of comments from each candidate's Facebook page was taken, and the negative ones filtered out. Grammarly then took a random sample of at least 180 messages from remaining comments and examined them for errors—focusing on things such as misspellings and punctuation" (USA TODAY 10-7-15).

How did everyone fare? According to Grammarly the most mangled English language treatment added up to "12.6 boo-boos per hundred words." And the most grammatically correct supporters posted responses averaging 3.1 errors per hundred words. And so between 3.1 and 12.6 errors per hundred words you'll find all the candidates' supporters spread out. Makes you wonder how you and I would do, doesn't it?

I'm sure we'd all agree, though, that checking our grammar is hardly a fair way to evaluate a candidate. Why should the way I spell or write reflect on someone I support?

And yet, wasn't Jesus suggesting as much in the Sermon on the Mount? **"Let your light shine before others,**

that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16). Because the truth is: how

we live our lives—how we comport ourselves in public, in private—very much reflects on our parents, our spouses, our children, our friends, and even our employers—doesn't it? Then how much more does how we live reflect on the God we love!

"The church of Christ, every individual disciple of the Master, is heaven's appointed channel for the revelation of God to [others]. . . . The divine love glowing in the heart, the Christlike harmony manifested in the life, are as a glimpse of heaven granted to men [and women] of the world, that they may appreciate its [His] excellence" (*Thoughts from the Mount of Blessing* 40-41).

And so let your light shine, Jesus invites us, with the glow of divine love, the glow of divine compassion—which is precisely what the disenfranchised and alienated among us need from us more than anything else right now (I'm thinking of what we shared last Sabbath in "The Pugwash Factor"—4). Let your light shine so the world, the hurting, the needy, the lost, the lonely may experience God's compassionate love *through you* and thus be drawn *to Him*.

No app to download—just the daily infilling of Jesus so that little things of life—our words of compassion, our acts of kindness, our gestures of friendship—might leave the strongest impression of all.

PRAYER

IN THE GREAT CONTROVERSY

We know there is a Great Controversy about God, His character, and name; questioning His integrity, honor, truthfulness, and trustworthiness.

- There is an antagonist who is working to thwart God's plan in the kingdoms of men and our personal lives (Job 1 & 2; Revelation 12:17).
- The Devil uses pride, force, manipulation, coercion, back-room dealing, and gossip to achieve his purposes.
- Christ uses love, encouragement, truth, open communication, and reasoning together to achieve His purposes; and also provides protection and freedom to make our own choice.
- Jesus' rebuke to Satan through Peter shows that the Devil can and does work through humans (Matthew 16:23).
- Wherever we see force, manipulation, or coercion at work in the home, church, or schools, we can take the opportunity to tell God all about it and ask Him to intercede. We also can speak up with our concerns when prompted by the Holy Spirit.

We are told that a good name is much more precious than great wealth (Proverbs 22:1 & Ecclesiastes 7:1)!

- God's name is His glory, His character, reputation, fame, and status.
- His honor is His integrity, decency, respect, admiration, esteem, and righteousness.

- To *know* God is to recognize, identify, acknowledge, understand, and appreciate His character.
- The word "sake"—is for someone's benefit, interest, or welfare—for their good.
- To be jealous for God means to be protective, alert, observant, vigilant, caring, longing and hoping for His best interest. We are jealous for the sake of His honor, reputation, and name.

Do we see God's name and reputation attacked today? If we are jealous for God's name, won't we seek to protect His reputation and character and desire to share His character with others?

GOD'S PROVIDENCE (HIS TIME TO WORK AND BECOME KNOWN)

How can we recognize God's providence? How do we know when it is time for God to act? How can we tell when we are to pray for Him and speak up in His defense? Look at the lives of Daniel and his three friends. All made a commitment to the God of their fathers; a commitment to work to the best of their ability by relying on Him. What was their response to setbacks and being falsely accused?

- **The Dream:** You are sleeping peacefully when there is a loud knock on the door (Daniel 2). You are told you are to be executed because the king cannot remember a dream! It is a signal that God



wants to work and He needs some people to help Him achieve His purpose—even though the purpose may not be seen immediately. Wake up and pray God's purpose be revealed to you!

- **The Image:** Daniel's friends knew what was coming (Daniel 3). They had seen the image being built, which must have been "the talk of the town." They knew that the leaders from every province were to be present—they may have personally facilitated the "invitation" letters to be sent out! They knew what they were going to be asked to do; they renewed their commitment and prayed in advance for God's protection! This was God's providence made plain that He wanted His name and reputation known throughout the known world! This is why they responded to Nebuchadnezzar the way they did. Nebuchadnezzar even asked, "Who is that God that shall deliver you out of my hands?" He wanted to know; they gave him the answer!

- **The Lion's Den:** We are told that Michael had been working with Darius

from his first year (Daniel 11:1). This was the same time frame that Daniel was praying for His people (Daniel 9). In fact, Satan was working behind the scenes to either kill Daniel or make his intercession no effect (Daniel 6). But Daniel knew that this restriction on prayer was a providence of God—a time to again stand for the truth, honor, and character of God.

What has happened in the past where you now know God's providence was working, giving you the opportunity to make His name known to others or to stand in defense of His character?

What is happening now where you know God's providence is again creating a situation where you can make His name, reputation, and character known? ■

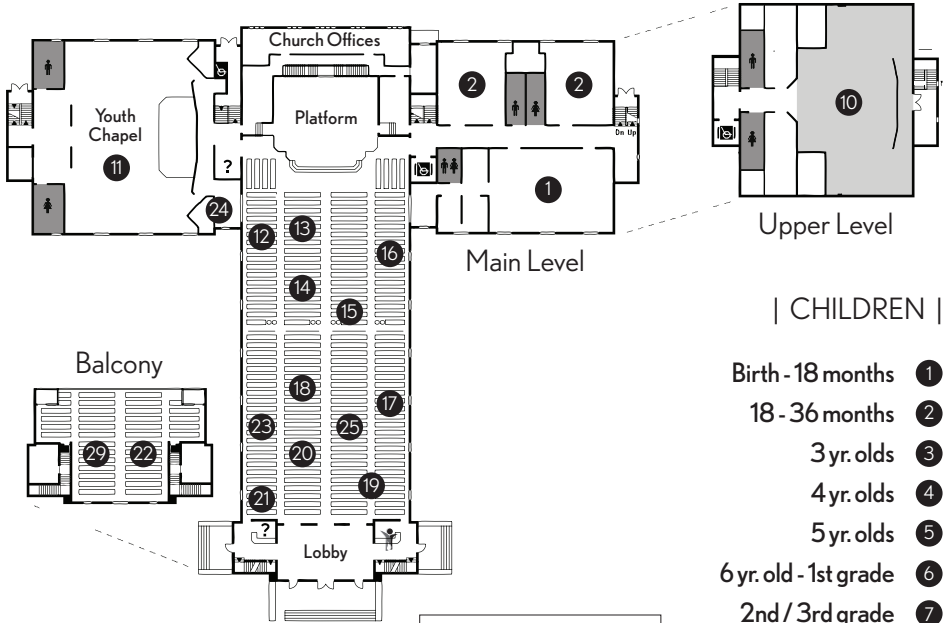

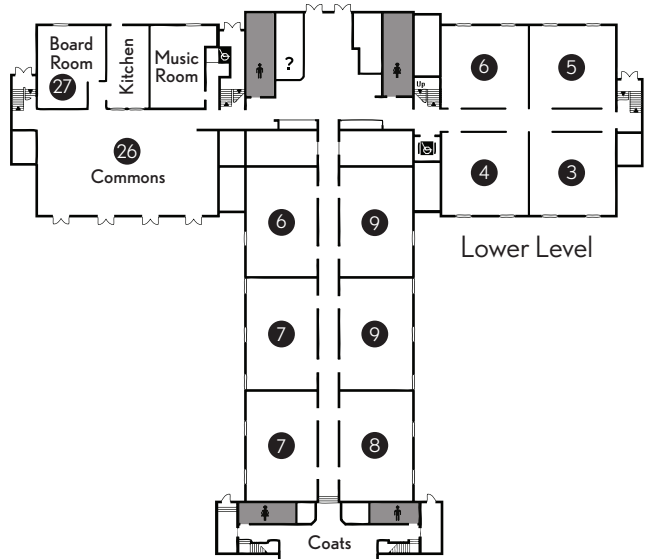

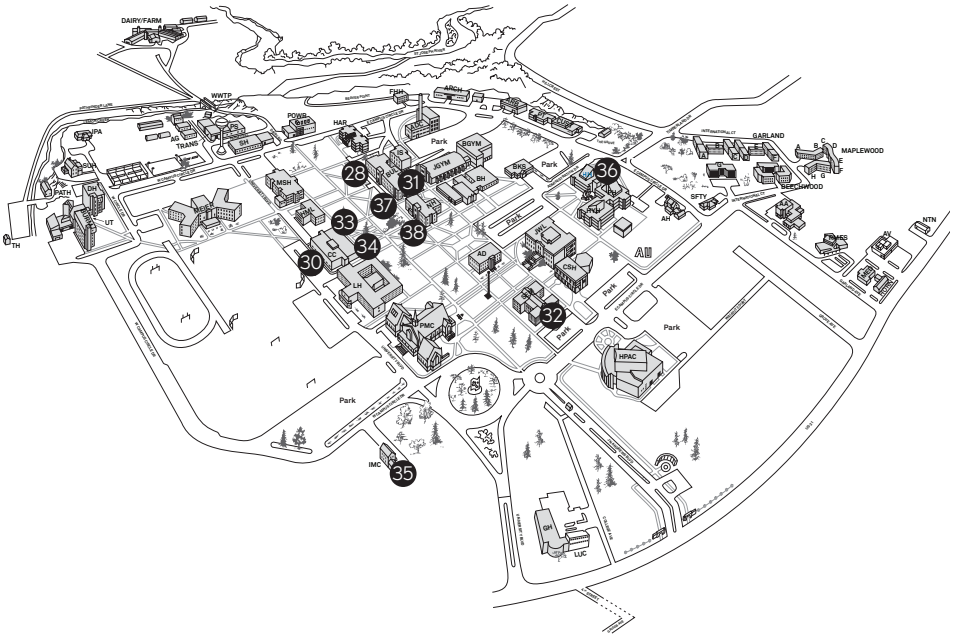
