THE BABEL OF BREXIT

as anybody on this side of the Pond (Atlantic) been able to figure out this United Kingdom brouhaha called Brexit? Since the mission of this Fourth Watch blog is to track the headlines in order to examine events or trends confirming time running out for our civilization, let's see if the big story preoccupying Europe these days is an indicator of the diminishing times.

The European Union (EU) is a group of 28 countries that operates as a cohesive economic and political block, with nineteen of the countries using the euro as their official currency (www. investopedia.com/terms/e/ europeanunion.asp). That much we know. For years the United Kingdom has been a card-carrying member of the EU. But three years ago, bemoaning the political, currency economic bonds that FU membership required and nostalgic for the days when Britain stood alone as a nation empire, majority of

(hence the moniker Brexit).

But trouble boiled over when the members of the British Parliament could not agree on just how that exit would best be accomplished. And the ensuing three years under Prime Minister Theresa May have been an unfolding saga of national deadlock.

A deadlock painfully evidenced this March in the repeated attempts of the Prime Minister to negotiate an orderly exit and the repeated rejections of Parliament to those efforts. But the onus now apparently is on the House of Commons which while rejecting the PM's proposals has been unable to offer a majority-supported alternative. Deadlock.

And the clock is ticking down on April 12's deadline for a decision. Google the story for the details—the bottom line is wincingly clear: confusion. Nobody in the UK, nobody in the EU, no government leader or political hack has been able to resolve the confusion and rather chaotic uncertainty (not in the press, the financial markets, or the electorate—nobody).

But speaking of the Fourth Watch (in the Roman reckoning, the darkest hour before night's end), should followers of the soon-coming Christ be surprised? The ancient Babel narrative is a morality tale writ large for this civilization today: "But the Lord came down to see the city and the tower the people were building. The Lord said, 'If as one people speaking the same language they have begun to do this, then nothing they plan to do will be impossible for them. Come, let us go down and confuse their language so they will not understand each other" (Genesis 11:5-7).

The European Union arguably is a

throwback to what some consider the halcyon days of the Holy Roman Empire, the Dark and Middle Ages union of European nations under the rulership of Rome. But the story of Babel and the towering image of Daniel 2 are biblical evidence of the divine "check" God has placed upon human/government unification. "Thus far and no further." The history of earth heretofore is one of the repeated attempts at global unification and repeated failures. "Thus far and no further."

The American writer Ellen White observed: "Henceforth in our day, the nations are to be in a very uncertain state. Kings and rulers [prime ministers and presidents] will be involved in greater perplexities than they ever thought possible." Sound familiar? Babel, Brexit. Chaos, confusion. Why? She goes on: ". . . this is because they are disobedient to the Word of the Lord and work entirely contrary to His principles" (Letter 12, 1897).

It is the lesson King Nebuchadnezzar had to learn, a lesson so few rulers over the millennia have ever learned: "In the time of those kings, the God of heaven will set up a kingdom that will never be destroyed, nor will it be left to another people. It will crush all those kingdoms and bring them to an end, but it will itself endure forever" (Daniel 2:44).

As for Brexit and the EU, there is one power quietly waiting for the vacuum of leadership to become so strong that its offer to lead the nations once again will be heartily accepted. One day.

And thus we live—all of us—in "the fourth watch" of history. And we know how the story ends. ■

indsey Pratt was introduced to the Pioneer Church congregation last Sabbath as the newest member of the pastoral team. As the first female youth pastor in Pioneer's 60-year history, we thought it was fitting to help you get to know her a little more. Youth ministry is a critical area, especially in light of the intractable, universal problem of large swaths of youth leaving the church.

During a thirty-minute conversation with Lindsey, this fact jumped out at me: She loves the church and is fully engaged in ministering to young people. She's so engrossed in ministry; I caught her as she was knee-deep in planning the nighttime programming for the International Camporee to be held in Wisconsin, just four short months from now.

So, how did her journey lead her to the campus of Andrews University?

She grew up in Central California, at the foothills of Yosemite National Park and it wasn't until her freshman year of high school that she discovered that God was very real. It was a realization that occurred when she began reading the Bible. "It was exciting to know that God was real and active in my life," she says.

As God became real in her mind, Lindsey became active. She spent a year at Pacific Union College, then enrolled at the Mission College of Evangelism in Oregon. Before long, the leadership team at Central California Conference, under the leadership of Jerry Page, drafted her and a few others to add a youthful voice to its evangelism team. "We traveled around to churches, did week-of-prayers, power weekends and trained youth leaders," she said of the 2005-2006 period. She then served as youth pastor of the Oakhurst Church from 2007-2009.

The call to return to school led her to Andrews University January 2010 where the theology major wasn't content to rest on her laurels. She took on the challenge of organizing busloads of students to conduct Sabbath afternoon outreach at the Harbor of Hope Church.

After graduating in 2012, Lindsey was hired by the Central California Conference to work with then Youth Director, Elden Ramirez, as their Youth Evangelism Team Director. But two years, later God called her back to Andrews University to study at the seminary and she completed her Master of Divinity degree in 2017.

Mentors have played a huge role in Lindsey's life. One of her first, Ellen Park, was the associate youth pastor at the Sonora Adventist Church. "She was open and honest about God and challenged me to find out about God," she says.

Another mentor is Steve Hamilton, who pastors in Paradise, California, a



community destroyed by recent wild fires. Hamilton hired her out of high school and had led the youth evangelism team. "He's a phenomenal pastor," she said.

These are just some of the people who have "poured into -and still pour into" her life. "I long to do that for the generations coming," she said.

"They gave me opportunities to get involved and gave me opportunities to do big things and make decisions and give Bible studies with my peers; believing in me that I could do it."

There's one person she's already pouring her life into and that's her adopted daughter Ellie. Ellie, who turned two recently, has given her a fresher perspective of God. "Bringing people to Christ and mothering have been the two best things in my life!" says Lindsey, beaming proudly. As if the life of a seminary student was not busy enough, Lindsey embarked on the adoption process during that her seminary studies thinking it would be finalized after graduation. However, it took just six months and she know this was God's

timing. "She's the perfect daughter for me!"

As a single mother, the 32-year-old is grateful for community and lessons she's learning in God's unending love. Ellie is teaching how to love deeply and grow patience. She says, "If it's been a long day or when I'm tired, you still have the ability to give."

Even though Lindsey is still several months from starting her role at Pioneer, she's beginning to think about the new chapter. One area of special focus will be ministry to public school students, and she plans to reach out to parents for help. "We're seeing from studies that parent involvement, that the home life is even more important than school, church, or anything else. If the kids don't have that, we need to figure out, as a church community, how to bolster that support around kids that don't have that in life."

In the meantime, she's looking forward to September. "I'm excited to join the team at PMC and get to know the community a little more," she says.




