
WHO WE ARE



Recently I attended a conference where the speaker asked two questions. What is the best gift you have ever received? And what is the best gift you have ever given? Hands waved, and stories were shared. A grandson told of the World War II dog tags he received from his adored grandfather. A prodigal daughter told of her re-baptism just three months prior to her father's sudden death. A friend talked of the forgiveness received after mean words were rapid-fired in an emotional moment. Funny, no one mentioned the white Lexus with red bow on top!

I thought about the best gift I have given. It was the love I put into writing a tribute for both my father and my mother. For weeks I edited and re-edited, trying to distill on one piece of paper what each met to me. I carefully chose stationary, font and matte, and had both tributes framed side-by-side in gold gild. The next time my parents visited, after supper dishes were done and a fire was lit, I read to each what would have been too hard for me to verbally articulate. Since then, those framed words have hung in the most prominent place in their home.

One of the most meaningful gifts I have received came a few years ago on my

birthday. At 5:30 a.m. I donned exercise clothes and headed for my walking partner's house. When I quietly knocked on her door, Shelly flung it open with a mischievous smile on her face. I heard cries of "Happy Birthday" behind her and began sorting out the individual faces of a group of friends. I was led to a gorgeous brunch prepared for me in the wee hours of the morning. We ate at a table set with linen and china and candles, and talked and laughed and celebrated friendship until the work day could wait no longer. I will never forget this gift. People (husband's included) got out of bed at 5:30 in the morning to let me know I was special!

The best gifts always have to do with relationships. Exceptional givers study their recipients and find ways to let them know how much they are loved and valued.

Are you an exceptional giver? Are you finding ways to let God know how much you love and treasure Him? Are you seeking to discover the gifts He longs for? He will show you how to be generous to Him, if that is what you truly desire. ■

PASSION PLAY RETURNS!

The Andrews University Easter Passion Play has returned! The event is an interactive indoor and outdoor walkthrough experience for the entire family, depicting the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Once again the event will take place on our campus on March 26. In a recent interview, Tiffany Bailey, the event's Assistant Drama Director, shared her perspective on all the hard work and planning that goes into this ministry.

So tell me about the Passion Play, in your words, what is its goal?

The Passion Play tells of the story of Christ and His life. It gives viewers a firsthand view of the life of Christ through of scenes of His life. In short, the goal of the Passion Play is to draw people closer to Christ. I feel that the ministry of the Passion Play can play a vital role in making the life of Christ come alive. Attendees are able to see the heart of the matter and that the life and death of Christ is not some lighthearted fairy tale. I think it brings people closer to Christ because when you experience what it was like to see Jesus die, it really makes you contemplate the sacrifice He made for us. It takes people from a faith of law, to a faith of practice. It's about the King of the universe being so in love with His people, that He gave us the gift of Salvation.



What goes into the planning of the Passion Play?

There is a massive amount of people that are needed. We do a lot of recruiting. There are over 1000 jobs that need to be filled. The majority of the positions are filled by student volunteers, however there are many people in the community who also volunteer. There are many committed individuals who are a part of the Passion Play; they give their time and talents with no pay, because they believe in this ministry and the importance of it. Logistics is another big part of it; making sure that people have what they need to complete their tasks and to make this big production happen.



What exactly does your job entail and how did you get involved?

As the Assistant Drama Director, I do a lot of support tasks; sending emails, creating calendars, and recruiting. . . . I was in the Passion Play twice before as an actor. It was a really good experience because I love acting and it gave me a chance to do something I was passionate about; and also be involved in the ministry. Last year, when the planning for this year's play started, I was approached by someone who wanted me to be involved in a bigger role. At first I didn't want to get involved because I am a full-time graduate student, but I felt that God wanted me to be a part of this.

As full time students how do you all find the time needed to put into this production?

There is a lot of time needed to go into this production. It consists of weekly meetings, rehearsals and recruiting. It also incorporates a lot of time outside of meetings. We have to do a lot of networking to find volunteers, it takes up a lot of our time. We started planning for this play last semester. We are passionate about what we do, so we find the time.

What has this experience been like for you?

It's been very challenging, [but] it has been a growing experience and a great way for me to be involved in ministry in a very big way.

ondrous in beauty, wondrous in subject, the traditional hymn melody WONDROUS LOVE infuses worship today with its simple sense of awe at the Christ of Calvary. Three stanzas of thought-provoking text appear with the melody as number 162 in the SDA Hymnal. The first stanza wonders at the Lord bearing the dreaded curse "for my soul." Stanzas two and three rejoice in the

prospect of rejoicing by singing with millions, and singing on and on-for eternity. And here is a fascinating cross-cultural footnote. Native American Methodists recorded that during the 1906 Indian Mission Conference, a famous Creek Native American Methodist evangelist, "although the last hours of his life are full of pain . . . died singing "What wondrous love is this, oh my soul."" ■
