

REMOVING THE ROOF

n Mark 1, we see Jesus delivering a demon-possessed man during Divine Service, curing Peter's mother-in-law at potluck, then healing nearly the entire town after vespers. After this particularly eventful Sabbath, Jesus goes to the surrounding towns and reminded Peter that this was the reason for which He came. But in the second chapter, Jesus returns to Capernaum and there is evidence to safely assume that He is at Peter's home again. This is where the paralytic is forgiven and healed after his friends let him down through the roof.

Whether it is Peter's house or not, there are several questions that we should ask ourselves as we think about this account.

• ARE PEOPLE EAGER TO VISIT MY HOME?

People flocked to Peter's house because Jesus was there. Neighbors knew that if they went to this home, they would find healing both for their body and their hearts. When opening our homes to others, we must ensure that the food we serve will not be a detriment to their health. Persons left Peter's home healed

of their maladies because the Great Physician was a guest there. The other side is that our neighbors should feel that they will leave our homes spiritually refreshed because Jesus "preached the word to them" (Mark 2:2 NKJV). This does not

mean that we will preach a sermon every time we have neighbors and friends over, but it denotes that everything done in our homes will aid our visitors in their walk with Christ. When God the Spirit lives in your home, people will come because they know

they will find love, forgiveness, and healing.

② WILL I BE ANNOYED IF SOMEONE REMOVED MY ROOF TO SEE JESUS?

We understand that the manner in which homes were built in ancient Israel allowed tiles to be removed and replaced. In our communities today, this is not so. Imagine your home being so packed with people that persons resort to climbing the roof in order to catch a word from God! Unfortunately, there are many of us who are hesitant to open our homes to others because we imagine the inconvenience they may cause us if they break a vase, spill cranberry juice on the white carpet, break an arm chair, or guzzle the last bit of orange juice in the fridge. When Jesus lives in our homes, persons will flock to our doors. The owner of the home probably had to rearrange the roof after the paralytic was healed, but that meant nothing when compared to the miracle that occurred.

ARE THE "SCRIBES AND PHARISEES" INVITED TO MY HOME?

The passage tells us that the scribes were sitting there while Jesus taught. The

account in Luke adds that Pharisees and teachers of the law from all over Galilee, Judea, and Jerusalem were there as well. Even though they were hypocritical and constantly plotting to murder the Messiah, here they were sitting in the

house listening to Jesus. It is unfortunate that God's people sometimes have a list of persons they would not invite into their homes. "Elder A is too critical, Sister B is unfriendly, Neighbor C is not a Christian, and Coworker D is unkempt and

therefore cannot be invited to my home for Sabbath lunch." It is easy to notice the flaws in people and find reasons to close our homes to them. But our gracious Father wants to save all of His children and sometimes the place where many can meet Christ is at your home. We ought to exercise caution to ensure the safety of our home but unwarranted paranoia should not be what hinders us from ministering.

Whether luxurious or humble, our homes do not belong to us. Rather, as His disciples, the Lord has lent us these houses so that we can minister to spiritual paralytics and even those who are pharisaical in nature. Most importantly, to learn to be like Jesus, we need Him in our homes. As a live-in member of your household, Jesus wants to be a blessing to you and your neighbors even if that means He has to remove your roof.

CODS HOUSE. ABLUEPRINT

here's a story about a little girl who wanted to draw God. Her teacher told her, "No one knows what God actually looks like." The child took her pen and paper and said, "They'll know when I'm through!"

We may not have see God in person, but we have been given a picture of what He looks like—His church. Thankfully, God has given us a blueprint for that kind of church. Church is what happens when people live the Gospel. Their influence has the power to transform a generation!

During our "God and Mister Rogers" sermon series, we are reflecting a blueprint of God's House, inspired by Acts 2:42-47. "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord

added to their number daily those who were being saved."

We have so far heard in this series about doing personal evangelism, being social, and knowing the Bible. We will hear about two more topics that describe an awe-inspiring church community where people grow. We'll end on August 6 with what a community like this looks like. It's a community we pray will happen so that we are ready to truly welcome each other and new people through the preaching of the Gospel, especially during Hope Trending. We have already begun practicing community through GROW Groups and will be doing the same through Watch Parties this fall. This summer at least 140 Pioneer members have been gathering in groups and creating a space for strangers to become neighbors and for neighbors to become friends. Friends becoming brothers and sisters in Christ is the transformation we are called to be a part of.

Jesus made disciples in groups because we grow better together. The church is made up of people who have committed to follow Jesus and care about at least one other person beyond their circle. The Apostle Paul said that the Gospel



could be summed up in this: "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Galatians 5:24). He echoes the teachings of Jesus: "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:35).

To love our neighbor as ourselves will take practice and our GROW groups are a training ground to get started. We don't have to do it perfectly, we just need to get started. People's hope depends on being able to "see" God at work. Why not through His church? Do we have any doubts about having what it takes

to fulfill God's call? Here's the Matthew 28:20 promise that gives us courage and power to go and grow disciples in His Name: "I AM with you."
