(The Christian Doctrine of God 278) Ellen White: "Righteousness is ______, likeness to God, and 'God is love.' ... Righteousness is _____, and love is the light and the life of God." (Thoughts from the Mount of Blessing 18) The R-word, in fact in its quintessence, is _____ himself. Then why did Martin Luther have such struggle over "the righteousness of God?" 3 "I greatly longed to understand Paul's Epistle to the Romans and nothing stood in the way but that one expression, 'the justice [righteousness] of God,' because I took it to mean that justice whereby God is just and deals justly in punishing the unjust. My situation was that, although an impeccable monk, I stood before God as a sinner troubled in conscience, and I had no confidence that my merit would assuage him. Therefore, I did not love a just and angry God, but rather hated and murmured against him." (Roland Bainton Here I **Stand 49**) Do we live with a very similar struggle? Jeff VanVonderen—Tired of Trying to Measure Up: Getting Free from the Demands, Expectations, and Intimidations of Well-meaning People. -based systems are based upon . "We all need an environment where we feel our needs are met because of who we are and not because of what we do. In shame-based relationships, value and acceptance are earned on the basis of performance. Performance, however, always seems to fall short of the standard, giving us the message, 'You are defective and inadequate.' Eventually, we become ingrained with a need to measure up. What follows is more impotent performance, which generates even more shame. And on it goes." (41) "We're often taught that acceptability comes from 'useful' religious performance that lives up to the expectations of our particular religious community. And since human performance is an inadequate, false means to acquire value, it always falls short. Someone is always displeased, and even if he isn't dissatisfied, we are. We simply can't act perfectly enough." (42) No "shame-based system" with Paul—"I am not ashamed!" For "the righteous will live by faith"—not by shame, nor by performance.
