 - #3—God turned from a geographical Israel to a _____ Israel and a _____ Jerusalem to become the recipients of the Old Testament’s prophecies of future glory for Israel and Jerusalem.
 - Romans 9:6-8; 2:28, 29; Galatians 3:7, 8, 28, 29; 6:16
 - Through faith in Christ a _____ spiritual Israel has been born, inheriting all the promises made to Abraham, the father of the Jews.
 - I Peter 2:9—The new community of spiritual Israel is a “holy _____, His own special people.”
 - #4—Therefore, Old Testament prophecies regarding Israel’s future, that would have been literally fulfilled had Israel remained obedient to God, must now be _____ to spiritual Israel, focusing on

- spiritual intent rather than geographical detail.
- ◆ Therefore, the deliverance promised in Daniel 12:1 is not for the nation of Israel but rather for the _____ of God the world over.
 - Daniel is clear—they are not delivered because they are his people—they are delivered because their names are written in the book—“the Lamb’s Book of _____ ” (Rev 21:27).

 - What awaits God’s people at the end of time (Daniel 12:1)?
 - ◆ They will face the most dreadful crisis in the _____ of time.
 - Jesus—“ . . . unless those days were shortened _____ flesh would be saved [NIV—“no one would survive”].” (Matthew 24:21, 22)
 - *Great Controversy* 622: “It is often the case that trouble is greater in anticipation than in reality; but this is _____ true of the crisis before us. The most vivid presentation cannot reach the magnitude of the ordeal.”
 - “It is in this life that we are to separate sin from us, through faith in the atoning blood of Christ. Our precious Saviour invites us to join ourselves to Him, to unite our weakness to His strength, our ignorance to His wisdom, our unworthiness to His merits. God’s providence is the school in which we are to learn the meekness and lowliness of Jesus. The Lord is ever setting before us, not the way we would choose, which seems easier and pleasanter to us, but the true aims of life. It rests with us to co-operate with the agencies which Heaven employs in the work of conforming our characters to the divine model. None can neglect or defer this work but at the most fearful peril to their souls.” (GC 623)
