

RELIGION MAY BECOME "EXTINCT?"

On March 22, bbc.com released a story that has set the blogosphere abuzz. The headline reads: "Religion may become extinct in nine nations, study says" (http://www.bbc.co.uk/news/science-environment-12811197). Before examining that list of nine countries, here's the logic behind that conclusion.

The American Physical Society (APS), meeting in Dallas recently, released research based on non-linear dynamics, a mathematical model used to analyze data. Examining religious affiliation census data extending back a century for numerous countries, and then correlating that data with known social motives behind being religious or not, the APS concluded that for these nine nations the trends indicate that eventually social motivation for

WANTED IMMEDIATELY: A BRIDE

've often marveled at the way God answered Eliezer's prayer when he was seeking a bride for Isaac. Two things are worth noting about God's response: (1) the specific nature and (2) the immediacy of the answer. While Eliezer was STILL praying God IMMEDIATELY brought Rebekah, who would prove to be the perfect bride for Isaac—that was a fast specific answer to prayer. I am grateful God is both willing and able to answer our prayers.

Do you wish God answered your prayers as specifically and quickly? I think He wants to! But I don't think most of us are prepared to receive specific quick answers, at least for such an important area of life. To receive such specific quick answers require a profound confidence in God. Most people would consider making such an im-

portant decision so quickly an act of unparalleled stupidity.

Recall that Eliezer was seeking a wife for Isaac. He went with specific instructions as to where she was to be found, and how she was to respond. Failure in either case would free him from his quest. He went committed to find the perfect person, asked God to answer His prayer, was fully prepared to accept God's choice, and as a result obtained an immediate answer.

Are you serious about revival? Are you prepared to immediately obey God's instructions in pursuing revival? God is also seeking a bride. His instructions are clear. He is anxiously waiting to answer. Are you prepared to receive His specific, quick, perhaps life-changing, answer in your life, in answer to prayer.

"Now let it be that the young woman to whom I say, 'Please let down your pitcher that I may drink,' and she says, 'Drink, and I will also give your camels a drink'—let her be the one You have appointed for Your servant Isaac...." Gen. 24:14

joining a religion will diminish until (mathematically speaking) no one in the country will be religious.

"The idea is pretty simple,' said Richard Wiener of the Research Corporation for Science Advancement, and the University of Arizona. It posits that social groups that have more members are going to be more attractive to join... For example in lan-

guages, there can be greater utility or status in speaking Spanish instead of [the dying language] Quechuan in Peru, and similarly there's some kind of status or utility in being a member of a religion or not." The reality that more and more people

in these particular nations "are identifying themselves as non-affiliated with religion," Wiener pointed out, led to this study's conclusion.

In what nine countries is religion predicted to become extinct? Australia, Austria, Canada, the Czech Republic, Finland, Ireland, the Netherlands, New Zealand, and Switzerland. In the Netherlands 40% of those surveyed declare themselves non-affiliated with religion—in the Czech Republic that figure climbs to 60%. And what about the United States? Commenting on the BBC report, theblaze.com indicates that nationwide 15% of Americans now claim no religion, making them the only religious group "growing in all 50 states."

Obviously, no mathematical formula or theory exists that can accu-

rately predict the spiritual realities of the collective human heart. And yet two millennia ago Jesus himself wondered about the spiritual state of humanity just before he returned to earth: "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?" (Luke 18:8). Will he?

Though Dylan Thomas was not decrying the loss of faith on the earth, his

fiery admonition might serve the friends of Christ well, we who must yet move into the gathering darkness to share the promise of light:

Do not go gentle into that good night.

Rage, rage against the dying of the light.

"Rage" is hardly an

irenic term—but it can depict the fiery passion of the Spirit against the gathering nightfall of faith, can't it? Yes, the numbers of the non-affiliated are on the rise in nations once considered Christian. But No, the friends of the Son of Man need not "go gentle" into the approaching night. Rather, let the Radicals, this new generation of missionaries, rise up with the fervor of Christ himself and move into these nine nations (and many more) with the faith of the Savior bright in our own hearts and fresh on our own lips.

Rather than simply raging "against the dying of the light," is it not better to light a candle in the dark instead? After all the night belongs to Christ. And it may yet be that with our candles high the Son of Man will find faith on the earth when he comes.

MUSIC ALIVE

LOVE IN WORDS

od's love for humankind is a theme appearing frequently in hymns by Charles Wesley (1707-1788), perhaps nowhere more powerfully than in "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling." The imagery of this vivid hymn seems transcendent, yet somehow personal. It is a poetic celebration of God's seeking in love the redemption of fallen humanity. One commentary states that "Wesley had a gift for writing poetry; he

wrote verse continually, his letters often being in rhyme. . . . " He was a most prolific hymn writer, credited with more than 6,500 hymns. Wesley approached hymn subjects from a standpoint that transcended objectivity to embrace personal feeling. His hymns "appealed to the spiritually starved people who, under the preaching of the Wesley brothers [John and Charles], found renewed life, hope, and faith in the Scriptures."

SPIRITUAL PARENTING

THE "SMALL VOICE"

Recently I've been asked two questions that relate to Easter. One was by a parent with young children who is wondering about the best ways to recognize and celebrate Easter, and the other was

by a fifteen year-old who was wondering about the Easter bunny.

QUESTION ONE: Easter wasn't really celebrated in our church when I was growing up, but I don't think we can totally ignore all the holiday decorations and festivities around us. What do Adventists really

believe about celebrating Easter?

Here are some things to consider:

- Easter is defined as a festival commemorating Christ's resurrection.
- Easter is one of the most important religious holidays for most Christians.
- Easter is steeped in tradition and rituals developed over centuries.
- Easter also has its secular side with Easter bonnets, bunnies, chocolate eggs, and Easter Baskets.
- Ellen White does not make mention of the word Easter in her writings, but she certainly has much to say about the significance of Christ's death and resurrection

Easter is a time for remembering. We remember Christ's acts of love for

us, His suffering, and most of all His triumph over death, which gives us hope for the future and the promise of eternal life. We remember the power of restoration and renewal.

Easter can also be a time to focus

on impossible things done by God, either directly or through those men and women who listened to Him and acted in simple faith. Christ's birth seemed impossible, His life οn earth seemed impossible. His crucifixion seemed impossible, and certainly His resurrection seemed

impossible. This is a time we can help our children contemplate the impossible things God continues to do in our lives.

When we moved to Andrews University and began attending PMC, there was little mention of Faster. But now we celebrate with the Passion Play on campus and our own Easter Sabbath tradition of taking flowers to the cross in remembrance of loved ones. This beautiful tradition is now part of the fabric of our church. It gives us an excellent opportunity to share stories with our families about the people who are honored, to talk about the resurrection promise and how much it means to us. It gives us an opportunity to talk about death and grief in age-appropriate ways with our children. If you haven't specifically talked about why people

take flowers to the cross, I invite you to take this opportunity this year.

QUESTION TWO: What does the chocolate Easter bunny have to do with Easter anyway?

There is no story in the Bible about a long-eared, cotton-tailed Easter Bunny. And real rabbits don't lay eggs either. So why are these traditions so much a part of Easter Sunday? What do they have to do with the resurrection of Jesus? Well, nothing! They were incorporated into the celebration of Easter separately from the Christian tradition of honoring the day Jesus Christ rose from the dead.

The Easter bunny can be traced back to pre-Christian Germany. Spring symbolized new life and rebirth, and eggs were an ancient symbol of fertility. These already practiced pagan traditions and the celebration of Christ's resurrection merged when Roman Catholicism


became the dominant religion in Germany. The first story about a rabbit laying eggs and hiding them in a garden was published in 1680. In the 1700s German immigrants who settled in Pennsylvania brought the tradition of the bunny rabbit and the eggs to North America. Nests for the rabbit to lay its eggs in soon followed. As time went on nests became decorated baskets and colorful eggs were swapped for candy, treats and other small gifts.


In closing, I invite you to consider your own Easter traditions and why you celebrate in the way you do. If you don't participate in activities that others around you enjoy, explain to your children the reasons for your beliefs and practices. As Christians we can all bask in the promises of spring and the lasting power of the resurrection.


