FEAR FACTOR OPENS NEW MARKET FOR SEEDS

hat headline two days ago caught my eye. What in the world do seeds have to do with fear? I read on. "The news is unquestionably frightening: political turmoil at home and abroad: worries over oil, gas, and food prices; earthquakes, tsunamis, nuclear meltdowns ... And that's just in the last few months. Marketers are on high alert. Doomsday is nigh! they shout online and on late-night TV as they hype 'survivalist seed banks' and 'apocalypse gardens' to the nervous and fearful. More than a dozen companies offer deals of up to 94,000 vegetable seeds, stored in tightly sealed buckets and 'ammo boxes,' that will feed a family of four for years or decades" (http://articles.philly.com/2011-04-18/ news/29443489_1_vegetable-seeds-lettuceplant-garden).

THE GOLDEN KEY

Could not better express my feelings now than by using the language of the 126th Psalm: 'When the Lord turned again the captivity of Zion, we were like them that dream. Then was our mouth filled with laughter, and our tongue with singing. The Lord hath done great things for us, whereof we are glad.''' So wrote, John Mecredy, the pastor of a church in Saintfield, Ireland, of the great changes occurring in his church in 1859.

"No power but the Holy Spirit could have caused such a blessed change, as has taken place among our dear people.... In fact it is beyond anything we had expected.... As to prayer meetings, people now delight in coming to them who could not be induced to do so before. In fact, so little interest was taken in the weekly prayer meeting for some time previous that it was about to be given up."

Pastor Mecredy wrote of how he joined another pastor in calling the members of the Young Men's Society to pray weekly at a united prayer meeting, at which the attendance averaged 40 people.

He also wrote of telling his people about the good revival work God was doing in America, Wales, Scotland and Ulster, and how a "spirit of inquiry" had awakened. As a result members of the churches began earnest praying for the descent of the Holy Spirit. "Yet things remained much as usualgreat carelessness and indifference with many." Then the attendance increased, though the same careless indifference remained.

Mecredy, fearing that his church would be "passed by," preached on Lam. 5:20,21, where God is asked to turn his people to Himself, and confessed that eleven years had gone by without a single conversion taking place under his ministry. He begged them to go to their closets and seek the Holy Spirit.

Suddenly members began coming under conviction, were being converted, and began sharing what God was doing with the people around them. Eventually a great revival came to the pastor's church.

"And so one after another were stricken-some in their own houses, others at our meetings, until at length above two hundred... found peace with God. The prayer meeting then became crowded; so that I have seen twelve hundred people in attendance night after night." "Now there are crowded congregations upon the Sabbath; many come out to hear who for years did not.... Instead of shunning religious conversations with their minister, they are anxious for it."

Wouldn't it be wonderful if our House of Prayer meeting were crowded because of the presence of the Holy Spirit? Revival is our greatest and most urgent need, and God wants to grant it more than we are willing to receive it. Help turn the spiritual tide in our own church by being part of the praying vanguard who will earnestly pray for a similar descent of the revival-bringing *Holy Spirit in our day!*

PASTOR'S BLOG

Can you believe it? You can now order 94,000 vegetable seeds to pack away in your basement or bottom drawer in the event of an emergency! Just in case. Are people buying? "'It's going well, a little too well right now. We didn't really anticipate that we'd get busier every time something happens,' says Dustin Merritt, co-owner of *Emergencyseedbank.com* in American Fork, Utah." In fact, Merritt claims that his company is doing as much business now per month as it did in three months last year.

Not everybody's a believer, of course. "If disaster struck, how would anyone be able to even start a garden, let alone keep one going for 10 or 20 years?" And besides, as one master-gardener quipped, "You don't need to buy thousands of seeds unless you're going to feed the whole country."

The point? Like the rest of the world, Americans are easily spooked. And the spate of bad news of late has jacked the profits of survivalist sales. But are 94,000 seeds really going to save us?

But on this Passion weekend when Christendom relives the explosive story of Jesus' resurrection 2000 years ago, the juxtaposed ideas of seed and fear may not be as farfetched as we think. For in that garden tomb outside Jerusalem's walls the divine Seed was buried behind a stone door. Just one Seed. But in that Seed the survivalist hopes of an entire race were pinned. For if that buried Seed were to rise from the earth alive and eternal—then the survival, the salvation of the human race would be assured, and fear—the endemic reality of life on this rebel planet—would be conquered. And so it was that in the angel's cry, "He is not here—He is risen!", the triumph of the Seed and the salvation of the world were pro-



nounced. And so it is that we gather to celebrate the Risen Christ every time we worship!

Then ponder the words of the poet, John M. C. Crum, in this paean of praise for our Savior Seed:

MUSIC ALIVE

LOVE IN WORDS

"Alleluia!" rings out in today's Latin, from the Hebrew "hallelujah" meaning "praise ye the Lord." This radiant word appears in Psalms 111 to 113 and 115 to 117, as well as in several verses of Revelation 19 as the cry in heaven "of a great multitude." As commonly sung, Charles Wesley's joyful text "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" has alleluias interspersed (al-

though these alleluias were not in Wesley's original). Indeed, "alleluia" often is an expression of joy over Christ's resurrection. It also graces the words of the hymn underlying today's instrumental Worship in Music. (Compare hymn no. 172, the third stanza of which declares, "The pow'rs of death have done their worst, But Christ their legions has dispersed. Let shouts of holy joy outburst.")




