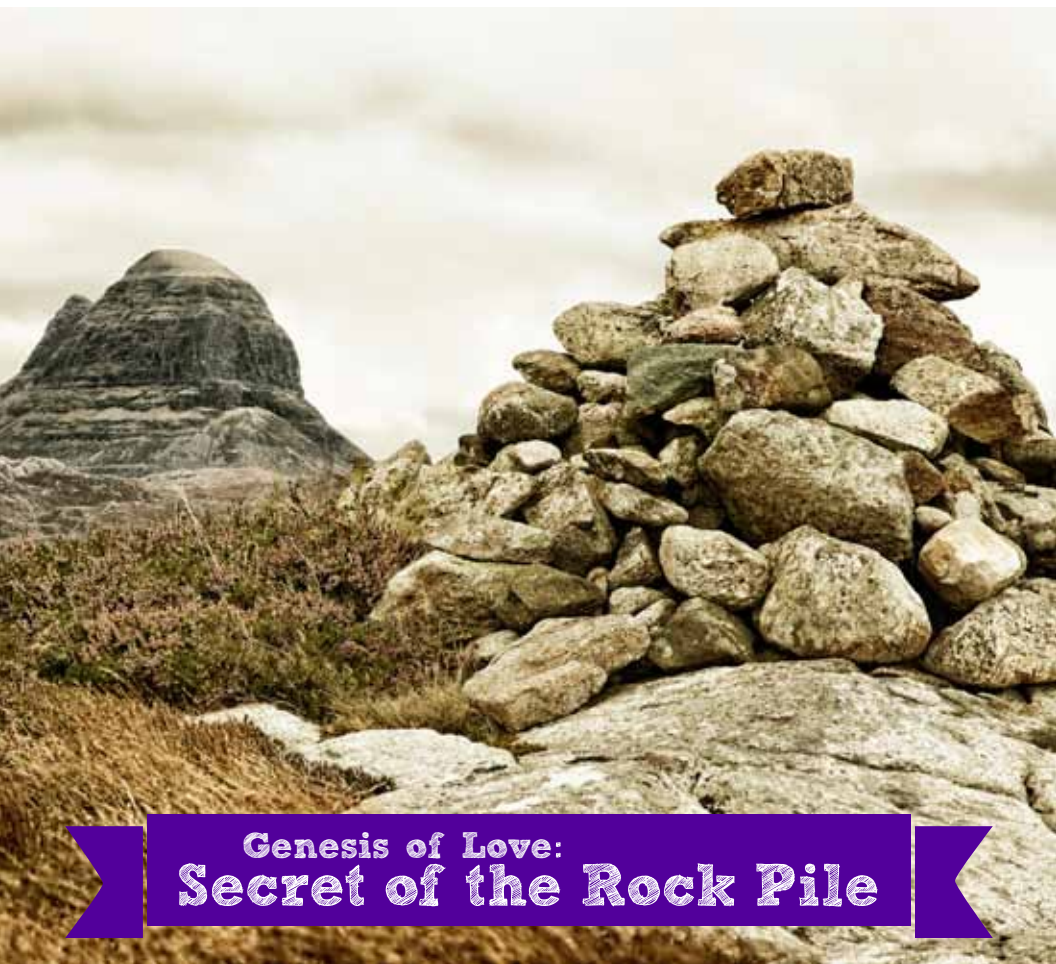

REMEMBER JOHNNY CARSON?

Paging through my newspaper this week I spotted a familiar face—the late Johnny Carson, “The King of Late Night,” as the new Peter Jones PBS documentary coronates him. I read on: “He had everybody in stitches for 30 years, but offstage Johnny Carson was not the life of the party” (*South Bend Tribune* May 14, 2012 p B7).

I kept reading: “Carson was shy and often anti-social. . . [His] reserve probably stemmed from his unyielding mother, Jones surmises. ‘I think it all traces back to his relationship with his mother, Ruth Carson, who for his entire life, he tried to get her approval and her love. And she withheld it, no matter what.’” I kept reading: “When he premiered on Oct. 1, 1962, hosting ‘The Tonight Show,’ an interviewer asked Mrs.

EARLITEEN SABBATH SCHOOL / HOW TO PRAY

Recently the seventh- and eighth-graders in the Earliteen Sabbath School had a lesson series about prayer. Students learned the A.C.T.S. method of prayer which led them into personal, effective and powerful communication with God. A.C.T.S. is an acronym that points us to the four specific components of prayer – Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving and Supplication.

To practice the **adoration** type of prayer, earliteens wrote on small stones some wonderful characteristics of God. They piled the stones together forming a type of altar reminiscent of the one constructed by the ancient Israelites after crossing the Red Sea. Next, the young people focused on the **confession** aspect of prayer. They learned that sin separates us from God, but confessing our sins in prayer before God clears the way for a deeper relationship with Him. This led the earliteens to write on their hands in washable marker the sins that they wanted to confess to God. Then they washed these words off, symbolizing God's forgiveness for

their sins. **Thanksgiving** was the next subject discussed. Students counted their blessings, writing or drawing them on a 3 x 10 ft. paper. Finally, the last component of this prayer model, **supplication**, was explained. Earliteens prayed for others who were hurting, symbolically putting a Band-Aid on their hand. When they prayed for people in other parts of the world, they placed a smiley sticker on a world map, indicating the focus of their prayer. They also learned to take personal requests to God. Earliteens wrote out their concerns on paper and placed the messages to God face down inside an outline of a cross.

We pray that these kinds of activities can make a concept like prayer become very real. Like Paul, it is our desire to remind God's children to "be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let their requests be made known to God and the peace of God that transcends all understanding will guard their hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Phil 4:6

This was reported by National Public Radio (NPR) – citing this as the conclusion of researchers at Harvard University and the University of California, San Diego. It is of course a delight to be the one who "catches" a smile and the research revealed that happiness when passed on is passed on 3 degrees (friends of friends). AA / TOUR TO EUROPE

Andrews Academy students who traveled to Europe as part of the school's Reformation Tour were blessed with many new sights, sounds, foods and amazing experiences. The group visited medieval walled cities, cathedrals, chapels, castles and museums. They learned to distinguish between many types of architecture such as the Baroque, Gothic and Romanesque styles. Knowledgeable guides gave them a wealth of information as they toured the countries of Germany, Austria and Czech Republic. A musical highlight of the trip was the string concert they attended in the beautiful city of Prague.

Walking in the footsteps of Jan Huss who, unlike the priests of his day, believed the common people should hear the Word of God in their own language, gave them an appreciation for the courageous life of the reformers. They journeyed to visit the church where Martin Luther preached and the home where he lived. They visited the castle where Luther translated the New Testament into



German in just ten weeks. By visiting a concentration camp at Mauthausen in Austria, the Jewish Cemetery in Prague, the Berlin Wall and the Wall Museum, students saw what man will do to his fellow man when there is no reformation in his heart.

"This trip strengthened my walk with God significantly -- more than I had thought it would," wrote one of the students about her experience. "The best thing about the trip was that it really helped me notice how much Luther loved God and that I should be more devoted to Him."

Our prayer is that tours like this and each event at the school will impact the student's life in a positive way.

Carson what she thought. She said, "Well, I really liked Jack Paar [Carson's popular late night predecessor]. Johnny's not as controversial." Peter Jones then recalls another interview: "And then there was a cover story in *Time* magazine in 1965 that began with the reporter sitting with Mr. and Mrs. Carson watching a monologue [of their son]. It finishes. She gets up and says, "That wasn't funny" and walked into the kitchen" (ibid).

I put the newspaper down and mused to myself. How quick I am, how quick we are to render snap judgments about others, famous or unknown. After all, it seems fairly obvious to me that he (or she) suffers from a moral lack or a personality quirk or a character flaw. Sigh. But then, of course, not everyone can be as well-developed and well-nigh perfect as I (and you, too, of course). Sigh again.

But that's just it—I wonder if in fact we all are what we are today because of what or whom we grew up with. I'm no psychoanalyst (for which you can be thankful). And I'm not on a campaign to blame our parents for our own faults and failures. But I do wonder if perhaps we're too hasty to pre-judge (the root of "prejudice") another and cluck our tongues in self-righteous criticism, when if we knew what he or she grew up in or lived with (or lives with), we'd be a whole lot slower to render judgment at all.

Turns out our own humanity is very much a conglomerated jumble of genetic biases, environmental influences, and tangled relationships, isn't it? And whether we think about it

or not, our parents (or our memories of them) really do have a marked effect upon our lives, don't they? After all these years? Apparently.

I tore the article out and said a prayer for Johnny Carson, though he is dead. Because how many others are there who are still desperately trying to please an "unpleasable" parent? How many carry the burden (perhaps even unknown to them) of proving themselves worthy to a mother or a father? If only they, we (you and I) could experience the depth of another Parent's unconditional love and acceptance of us. **"I will be a father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty" (II Corinthians 6:18 Common English Bible)**. We have a Father who is already "well-pleased" with us. **"Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you!" (Isaiah 49:15 NIV)**. We have a Mother who will never reject us or forget us.

For some it is too late to heal the scars with a long-gone parent. But for all of us there is Someone who knows the secrets of our souls, and who loved us through those painful secrets—though never seen by us, He was always there by us. Only in Eternity, I suppose, will we know the depth of God's tender compassion and relentless love. Perhaps it will dawn on us when we spot the Johnny Carson's of this life in heaven's great innumerable throng. We will know it for sure when we find ourselves inside that very same multitude!
