### **MASTER PLAN** OF EVANGELISM

### **CHANGING LIVES / KINGDOM BUILDING**

Over the next twelve months, we are working with undergraduate and graduate students to conduct an evangelistic series in the city of Benton Harbor. This is a follow-up to the original evangelistic meetings conducted by PMC & Campus Ministries in 2004 under the leadership of Skip MacCarty and Chaplain Timothy Nixon. Those meetings resulted in 42 baptisms and formed the foundation for the Harbor of Hope Church.

There has already been positive interest from local pastors to participate in the General Conference's world-wide effort of evangelizing the cities in 2013. Our University students will also have an opportunity to share in revival and hastening the soon-coming of Jesus.

In preparation for those meetings there are several elements that we want to introduce as part of the seed-planting process. We are planning to hire a full-time person to coordinate the pre-work of literature distribution, small groups, and Bible studies, with the goal of developing a Branch Sabbath School. Along with that major effort will be complementary programs to

engage the community. Those efforts will include building a community gospel choir, partnering with Harbor Habitat to build new homes in the city, and conducting a city-wide summer basketball league to help connect socially with the many youth and young adults in the community.

It is our prayer and hope that this will help to bring revival in Benton Harbor and contribute to the General Conference's goal of kingdom building in the cities.

1960s and '70s college students were getting around eight hours of sleep each night. That number dropped to seven hours by the 80's. And surveys indicate it's closer to six hours a night these days. We are a sleep-deprived nation, college age or not.

But universities are no longer taking these numbers lying down. Campus campaigns, from Hastings College in Nebraska to the University of Louisville, are targeting adolescent biorhythms with campus-wide "flash naps" (an afternoon sleep-in, arranged in advance with public safety so they'll "know it's not an epidemic of something") or beds in the student center from which pajama-clad educators lecture passers-by on the value of even a quick afternoon nap.



The truth is sleep loss is more debilitating a practice than we first thought. University of Delaware psychologist Brad Wolgast observes that "many students who think they have attention-deficit (hyperactivity)

disorder are often just sleep deprived." He also notes: "When you find depression, even when you find anxiety, when you scratch the surface 80 to 90 percent of the time you find a sleep problem as well.' . . . (Wolgast is also seeing more students who've been prescribed sleeping pills, which he says usually harm sleep patterns more than help") (ibid).

So if you're having difficulty sleeping these days, why not drop by the campus counseling center. Help is much closer and even simpler than you thought. And what's not to like about turning some Z's into A's?

Unless, of course, we're talking about sleeping through the "last days." Our now concluding miniseries. "The Dark Night Rises," is anchored in a single New Testament passage that without apology warns us about sleeping through this climactic chapter in earth history. But Paul is describing a spiritual lethargy and drowsiness, not a physical sleep, "Stav awake and sober" he passionately appeals to his readers (I Thessalonians 5:6, 7). For wide-awake is the divine antidote to a civilization lulled into the "sleeping sickness" of the dark knight. To sleep now is a death trap, Christ Himself cautions (Luke 21:34-36). So "watch and pray." How? Give an ear to "The Dark Night Rises"—THREE.

In the end the good news is that the God who watches over you "neither slumbers nor sleeps" (Psalm 121:4). And when you have Someone who will keep watch with you through the dark night, what's there to fear, no matter how dark the night becomes?

And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed.

### **DEEP RIVER**

A frican-American spirituals often are rich with symbolism. "Deep River" apparently refers to the historic passage of the Israelites through the Jordan River by means of the miracle of the waters parting (Joshua 3). But it is reasonable to suppose that the reference to crossing over Jordan had at least two other levels of meaning to original singers of this spiritual. First, it referred to passing through

death to eternal life. Second, it referred to passing to the North and freedom, the reference to the Jordan conceivably implying the Ohio River. This spiritual's text, while brief, is meaningful: "Deep river, My home is over Jordan. Deep river, Lord. I want to cross over into campground....Oh, don't you want to go, To the gospel feast; That promised land, Where all is peace?..."






