SPEED!

Twin holiday tragedies this past weekend have preoccupied both the news media and the nation. We've all seen the pictures. The Metro-North Railroad train, its locomotive and seven cars upended, splayed and flung beyond the tracks and nearly into the Harlem River. Four dead, 60 injured. Just as tragic was the fiery crash of actor Paul Walker, star of the "Fast and Furious" movie franchise. A security camera captured the Porsche Carrera GT's explosion after slamming into a tree and concrete pole, killing both the actor and his friend and driver Roger Rodas.

Investigations are ongoing, but preliminary evidence suggests that excessive speed was the cause of both accidents. The Metro-North train was traveling 82 mph in a 30 mph zone around that sharp bend in the Bronx. Whether either accident was the result of human

“I WILL DO A NEW THING”

ANSWERED PRAYER OF A 13-YEAR-OLD

When my husband and I moved to Berrien Springs last Christmas (2012), we made a promise to our daughter that as soon as we found work she could go back to a Seventh-day Adventist school. After three years of homeschooling she appreciated this news! So she started praying that we would find work. In January our prayers were answered and she started at RMES just one week late into the semester. She had a great experience in the Junior High and made lots of wonderful Christian friends.

At the end of the semester my husband had not been able to find more work after his temporary job finished in April. We warned her that she probably would not be able to go back to RMES for 8th grade. It was with heavy hearts that we attended the 8th-grade graduation last June and saw her walk down the aisle with her 7th-grade classmates, thinking that she would not be taking part the next year.

All summer we prayed that my husband would find work, but nothing happened. In July we started to make plans to homeschool her again. Every time the subject was brought up she insisted that she was NOT going to be homeschooled but that she WAS going back to RMES! We tried to bring her back to reality and continued to make homeschooling plans. All summer she struggled with the possibility of being homeschooled and finally submitted to God, that He would

answer her prayer even if it was not what she wanted. The next day—10 days before the school year was set to start—my husband was given another temporary contract for several months. The day after that, we enrolled our daughter for her 8th-grade year at RMES.

She is having a blessed year at RMES and her Christian leadership skills, as well as her relationship with Christ are building a bright future. A big “thank you” to all the staff and everything they do for the children at RMES as they lead them to Christ.

The last few months have been a busy time for the youth in our PMC Evergreen Pathfinder Club. Pathfinders have taken classes for honors in Braiding, ADRA Community Service, Crocheting, Candlemaking, Model Rocketry, Glass Painting, Ham Radio, Whistles and Blacksmithing. We had our Fall Camp Out from October 11-13 at Chain O' Lakes State Park in Indiana. It was a wonderful weekend of canoeing, spiritual experiences and learning camping skills. Then, on the last Wednesday of October, we had our first "Fudge Night"—an evening of playing games, taking photos of our Pathfinders and their leaders in costumes, eating homemade fudge, and making cards for local nursing home residents.

In November we completed our first major Oshkosh fundraiser by making and selling pies. A total of 524 delicious apple pies were sold, just in time for the Thanksgiving holiday. Our major service project for November was the Thanksgiving food baskets. On November 9, Pathfinders spread out into the Berrien Springs community, passing out bags

from door to door requesting food donations. Working around the stormy weather on November 17, we picked up approximately three hundred bags filled with food. Finally, on November 23, the Pathfinders collected all the donations that church members brought forward during that Thanksgiving Sabbath service and spent the afternoon sorting and packing 100 boxes of food. Church members volunteered to deliver the boxes later in the day to 55 families. We are exceedingly grateful to God and our PMC church family for their continued support. —Jonathan Burt

YOUTH SABBATH SCHOOL / MAKING MISSIONARIES

Who is the best missionary to a lost group? The answer has been for years now someone who is a part of the culture. A peer. A native. The PMC Youth Sabbath School team believes this. Every Sabbath there are Corner Groups made up of intern pastors, collegiate young adults, community members, and most importantly the “natives” (high school youth). The Corner Groups meet during the week and prepare for what happens on Sabbath morning. It is an act of discipleship and mentoring. We believe the best missionaries are the peers.

Jon Nielson concludes that there are three common traits of youth who keep their faith.

1. **They are converted.** We need to stop being pleased with attendance at youth group and fun retreats. The focus must be whether they have experienced the gospel in a tangible and personal way.

2. **They have been equipped, not entertained.** If I have not equipped the students in my ministry to share the gospel, disciple a younger believer,

and lead a Bible study, then I have not fulfilled my calling to them.

3. **Their parents set an example by living the gospel.** The common thread that binds together almost every ministry-minded 20-something that I know is abundantly clear: a home where the gospel was not peripheral but absolutely central.

In Corner Groups we are focused on the first two but we will never be able to do the third. Parents, let's work together on making missionaries.

Definition of speeding—the accelerating velocity of an object. Even a society, a culture, a civilization can speed with acceleration toward an unintended end, can't it? The speed with which poverty is overtaking the human race is breath-taking. The speed that natural disasters now spread carnage across communities and countries is stunning. (BTW, Paul Walker, a practicing Mormon, formed the Reach Out Worldwide relief organization with his friend Roger Rodas to provide aid to global catastrophes—they were returning from a fund-raising event for the Philippines typhoon recovery when both were killed on Sunday.)

Speed. Given the velocity of national and global change—economic and social, technological and ecological—not to mention personal change, consider these two admonitions. *First, slow down.* Real life is both fast and furious. Which means it takes will power to intentionally slow down your pace. Slow it down at times even to a crawl—locking the door to your room or your office—

and crawling into the corner of your chair, your bed, your private space and closing your eyes, catching a nap, or simply savoring the quiet. Fifteen to 20 minutes—that's all it takes, as research shows, to revive your spirit, energize your mind and boost your productivity. During this frenetic but joyful holiday season, slowing down can be a life-saving strategy.

Second, stay alert. Reports indicate that the train engineer may have fallen asleep at the controls early Sunday morning. Spiritually speaking, falling asleep at the wheel is a disaster. **“Keep a cool head. Stay alert. The Devil is poised to pounce, and would like nothing better than to catch you napping” (1 Peter 5:8 Message).** Naps work in the physical realm, but in the spiritual realm, Peter is clear—you snooze, you lose. The stakes are exponentially higher. So stay alert. Especially in this season of good food, great friends and lots of fun—it's easy to drop your guard and lose your spiritual edge.

That's why I recommend for the holidays adding some time to your daily conversation with Christ. Another fifteen minutes beyond your usual—just you and Jesus alone in the Gospels—one story a day to relive with Him (click onto the “New Way to Prayer” banner on www.pmchurch.tv). So go ahead—slow your pace, catch your breath, calm your heart. **“Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest” (Matthew 11:28 Message).** What better Gift this Christmas than Him?

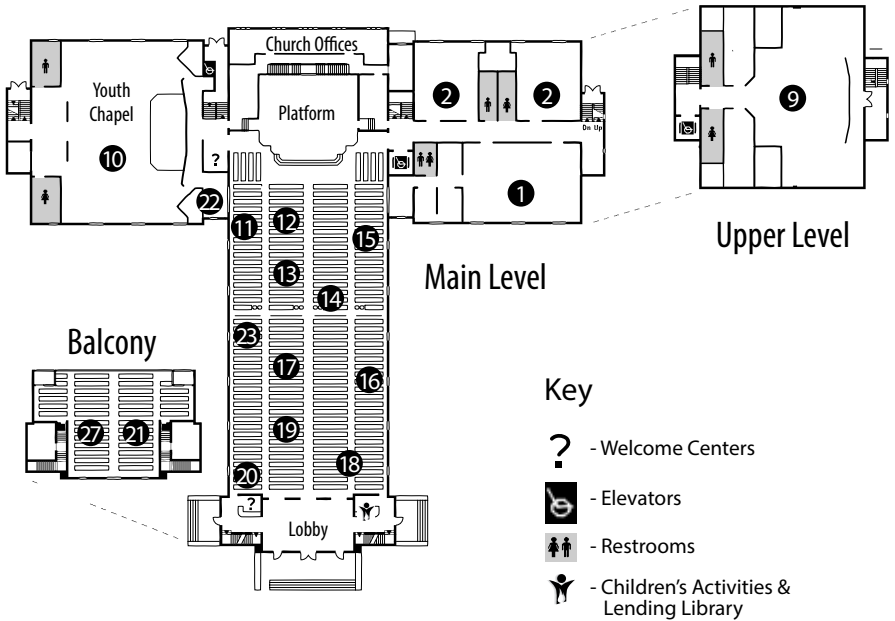

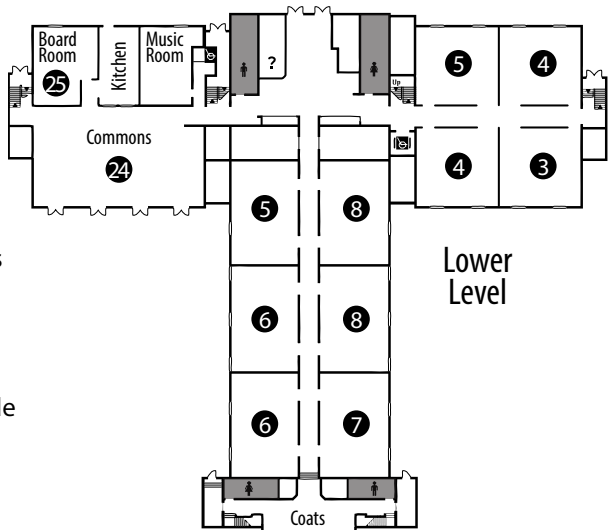

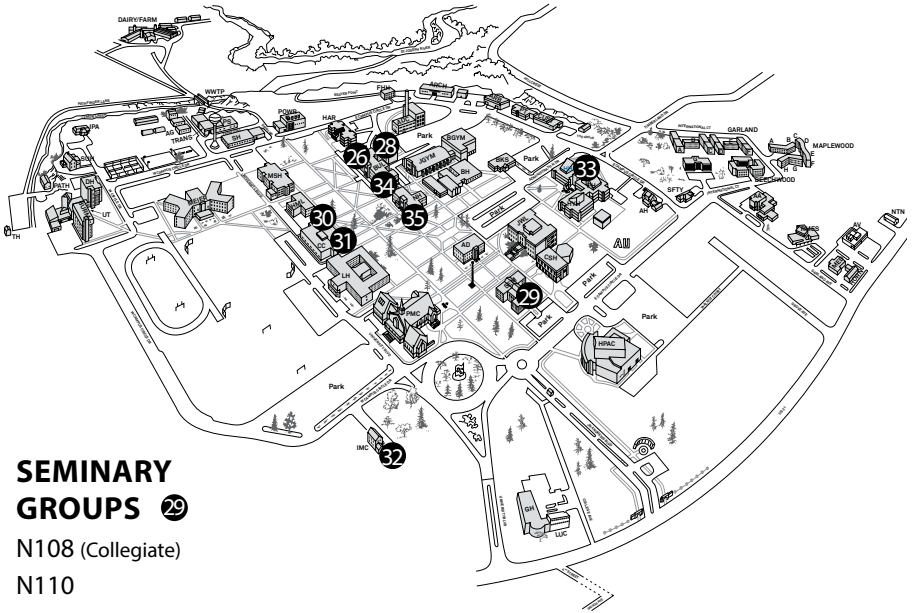
