THE NSA AND GOD

Who could be comfortable connecting the National Security Agency (NSA) with God in the same sentence? But read on. The *New York Times* this week broke a new story with further astounding details concerning the NSA's global surveillance program. Turns out the agency "has implanted software in nearly 100,000 computers around the world that allows the United States to conduct surveillance on those machines and can also create a digital highway for launching cyberattacks" (<http://www.nytimes.com/2014/01/15/us/nsa-effort-pries-open-computers-not-connected-to-internet>). According to the report, through on-site agents the NSA has been able to secretly insert tiny circuit boards or USB cards that transmit radio waves. Through those radio waves NSA monitors are not only able to "spy" on the content of those computers, but can also utilize those

EARLITEEN SS / MAKING CHRIST-CENTERED DECISIONS

Part of the reward for working in our Sabbath Schools is the opportunity to watch our young people grow into Christian young men and women. In Earliteens, we start working with kids when they are still shy seventh-graders all the way until they are confident freshmen. During this time, as any Sabbath School leader would say, "They go through so many changes!"



To help prepare our young people we try and challenge them to be aware of the issues that are facing the world today. Lessons on relationships, family matters, fashion, temptation, technology, ecology, and time management were all covered this past year. Before Brenda Schalk started teaching in Earliteens, we almost

exclusively took a traditional approach to table time and divided the kids into individual tables that were each led by a table teacher. Brenda found that some issues in particular lent themselves to a progressive approach. Instead of several tables, there are four stations that kids march through. The station might be creating a craft, filling out a handout together, or dialoging with each other to come up with proposed solutions to the issue being dealt with.

For the lesson on technology, the kids were asked to give up their electronics for the duration of Sabbath School. The resulting pile of devices was impressive. The students were challenged to think about how technology affects their lives and to recognize the need to make good choices about using that technology.

As much as it would be nice to shield our young people from all the potential evils that face them in this world, I believe that preparing them to be ready to make Christ-centered decisions is a better long-term solution.

same waves to launch a crippling attack on the computer system(s) of that nation.

The *Times* observes: “The N.S.A. calls its efforts more an act of ‘active defense’ against foreign cyberattacks than a tool to go on the offensive. But when Chinese attackers place similar software on the computer systems of American companies or government agencies, American officials have protested, often at the presidential level.” And so the revelations of the shadowy world of our government’s surveillance programs continue to unfold. Candidly, who of us would be surprised to discover that a video record of all our waking and sleeping is being kept in some hideaway subterranean fortress!

And God? OK, let’s be honest—the Bible is clear that a 24/7 record is being kept somewhere of every inhabitant of this earth. Jesus Himself taught: **“But I tell you that everyone will have to give account on the day of judgment for every careless word they have spoken” (Matthew 12:36).** Somebody’s keeping a rather exhaustive record, wouldn’t you say? **“For God will bring every deed into judgment, including every hidden thing, whether it is good or evil” (Ecclesiastes 12:14).** (Which, incidentally, means that the NSA’s covert activities are themselves being recorded on Somebody’s Supercomputer—call it poetic justice!)

PRAYING FOR YOU

During the past two decades, various members and pastors have called for a prayer ministry within PMC, asking members to intercede for worship leaders and members. As a result, prayer groups meet to intercede each Sabbath a few minutes before 9:00 and 11:45 AM in the prayer room behind the glass panels, on the left side of the sanctuary. We pray before and during the services that:

A) God’s Spirit will fill the church and worshippers.

B) We will not leave the service the same as we entered it.

C) God will use those leading to draw us to Himself.

D) Secular influences, memories, and impulses will be absent from the worship experience.

But you may ask, “What about the social climate inside the prayer room? What type of people will I encounter if I stop in to pray?”

I have found real encouragement from people who have come to the prayer room. For example, one person is a contemporary of my parents. Her husband was the first Black professor at AU in the 1960s. Her two older children were classmates of mine, grade eight through college, who have since fallen to cancer, and her husband died recently. Despite her struggles and heartaches, she never complains, and is a constant source of encouragement. Am I inspired by her prayer life? You bet I am!

Another person attending the prayer room reminded me that he

was a senior at Andrews Academy when I was a freshman. He shared a lifetime of struggle, from school through the Vietnam War, and to the present. He requested prayer for his battle with addictions, and noted that others in PMC may feel repulsed by his appearance. He expressed gratitude for Pastor Dronen giving him a ride to church, and for Pastor Nelson’s family sharing their Sabbath lunch with him. In response to his words, “I don’t belong here. I’m a square peg in a round hole,” I assured him that PMC needs him more than he needs PMC. Upon further reflection, I decided that the real question was, “Does Steve Mauro need him in church?” I know his participation in the prayer room was a tremendous blessing to me because of the necessary attitude adjustment in me.

In summary, the answer to the question, “What can you find in the prayer room each Sabbath?” You will find a great blessing in the Spirit, in worship, and with others who call upon the Almighty. –*Steve Mauro*

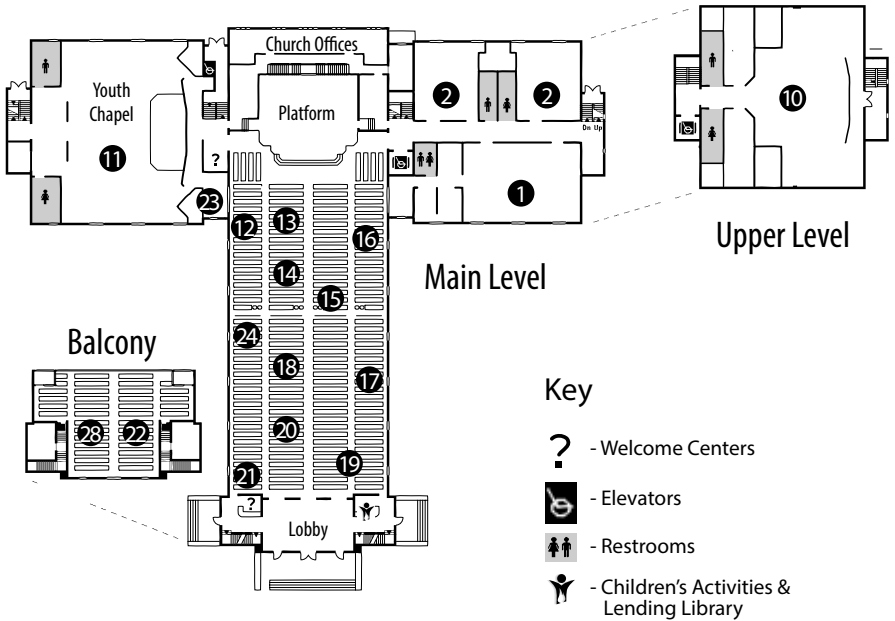

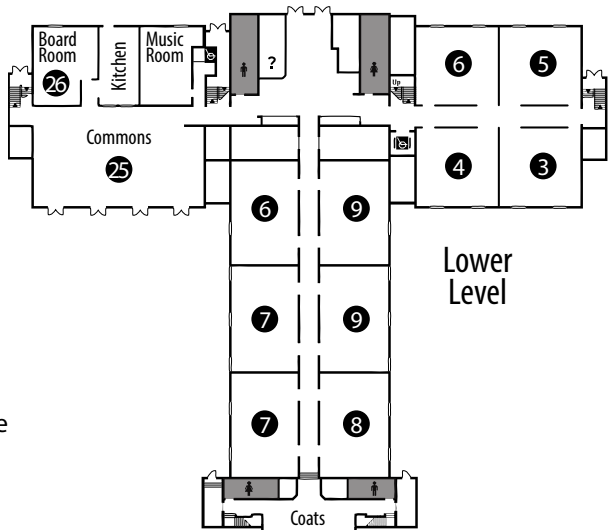

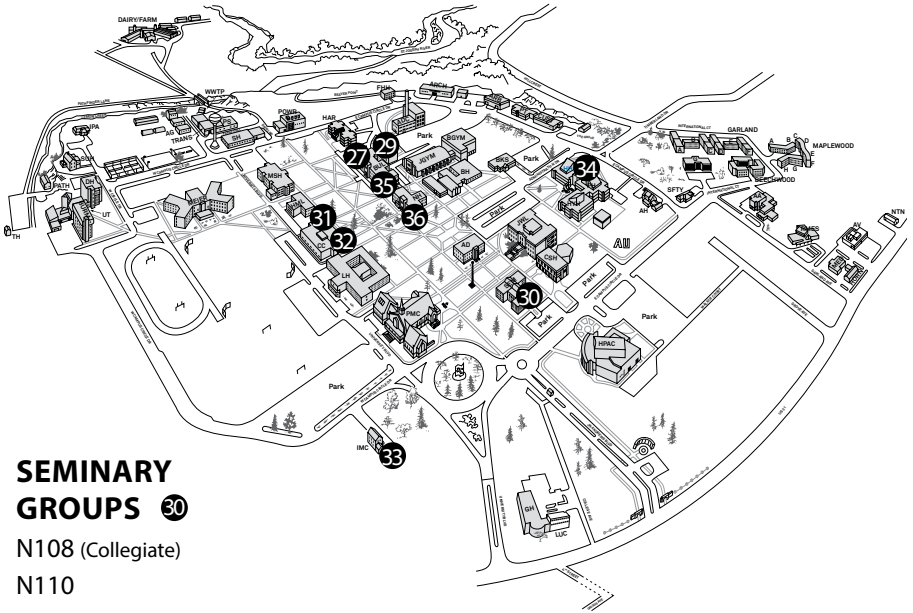
