“WAKE UP!

WAKE UP, PLEASE!”

The still unfolding heartache of the capsized Korean ferry *Sewol* with its entombed teenage passengers has gripped the world. Reports of text messages and phone calls from some of the high school students trapped inside the overturned and slowly sinking vessel (though many of the messages are now considered hoaxes) were fresh wounds in a nation mourning the numbing deaths of so many of its promising young.

The anguished wail of one of the parents should haunt us all. CNN reported: “Boat after boat, body after body from a capsized South Korean ferry came ashore Sunday morning, a solemn process interrupted by piercing cries and screams from passengers’ kin. . . . After an inspection, [the bodies] were carried along a path guarded by police—who themselves shed

"I WILL DO A NEW THING"

BEHIND THE CURTAIN

Occasionally in the Bible we have short glimpses into the inner workings of heaven and how God works through His angels (Genesis 28:12; Job 1 and 2; Psalm 103:20; Revelation 5:8, 9; 7:1-3 and 8:2-6). But nowhere in the Bible is there so much dramatic detail in showing the power of prayer as in Daniel chapter 10. We are told that Daniel was mourning and fasting for three full weeks in the third year of Cyrus (this was two years after the Jews had been allowed to go back to Jerusalem and rebuild). From the very beginning that Daniel sought to understand the previous visions through humility to God, his words (prayers) were heard (v. 12). We are also told that Michael personally came to influence the King of Persia. But the battle was against the power of evil that was trying to thwart and influence the King of Persia against God's purposes. We are even told that Michael stood up to confirm and strengthen Darius in the first year of his reign (Daniel 11:1), the same timeframe when Daniel was praying in chapters 6 (lions' den) and 9 (Jerusalem and the Sanctuary).

The picture here is that Daniel's prayers unleashed heaven's power to accomplish things on this earth that otherwise could not happen. It's as if the accuser is saying to God, "You can't intervene and work for your people, they aren't even asking for help. And even if they did ask, they must not have meant it because they only asked once or twice!"

With the knowledge that our prayers allow God to work in ways He might not otherwise accomplish, the Prayer Ministry at Pioneer Memorial Church invites you to join with us in praying for the Connect Card requests. GOD'S ABUNDANT PANTRY

GAP / SERVES IN ALL KINDS OF WEATHER

For over 35 years God's Abundant Pantry has served A.U. graduate student families. Every Tuesday and Thursday in rain, snow, or scorching heat, students line up to be served. PMC members support this ministry through their church expense offerings plus donations designated for "GAP."

Recently GAP received a grant from Feeding America for 5,600 pounds of food. The estimated retail value of the food was \$8,904. Attached is a picture of the 40' delivery truck from which 15 volunteers distributed the food to the students waiting patiently in the freezing cold.

Food items included fresh cabbage, onions, potatoes, apples and even some

raspberries. The onions, potatoes, and apples were delivered in large 15 to 20 bushel bins. This meant the volunteers had to quickly repackage these items into three six-pound bags.

Other items included two-quart cartons of fruit drink, five-pound bags of granola, bread, bakery goods, and much more. Over 100 student family units were served and leftover food was carefully stored away for future distribution.

RMES / OUTDOOR EDUCATION PROGRAM AT RMES

“The Creator chose for our first parents the surroundings best adapted for their health and happiness. He placed them in close touch with nature and in close communion with the holy ones of Heaven” (E. G. White, *Lifestyle Laboratory*).

Outdoor Education is part of Ruth Murdoch Elementary School’s curriculum. Every year our 5th- and 6th-grade teachers meet and plan this event to take place two days in April. This year, our teachers, along with the support of volunteers and the AU students in the science curriculum class with their instructor, led two full days of learning activities in the outdoors.

Their theme was “Nature Is God’s Art on Display for All to See,” and their key Bible verse “O, Lord, you have made so many things. How wisely you have arranged them!” (Psalm 104:24 TCW).

The activities included singing, praying, hiking, building a debris shelter, baking bread, animal tracking, measuring stream flow, measuring tree height, orienteering, marine mammals, and lichens, liverworts and moss.

The goals of the program were for students to learn about God and His creation as they develop an appreciation for the natural world, witness the character of God through the study of nature, and learn to be good stewards of the environment.



When some students were asked to share with us what they learned about God during the two-day event, they said:

“God made nature for us to live in and enjoy!”

“Nature is full of God.”

“God made nature for us to learn about Him.”

“He loves us.”

tears—and past even more outwardly emotional family members. These relatives cried and, in some cases, yelled loudly, clearly overtaken by the moment. Some of those shouts came from inside the identification tent. One man yelled out, ‘Wake up! Wake up, please!’” (<http://www.cnn.com/2014/04/19/world/asia/south-korea-ship-sinking/index.html?iref=allsearch>)



The image of that father weeping over the recovered body of his child, “Wake up! Wake up, please!”—how could we ever forget it?

And yet it is—perhaps not for us, but for the Father of this world—an even more stunning and urgent reality that an entire civilization today is entombed in a morally, spiritually capsized planet that will eventually slip beneath the cold waters of death. Unless they are rescued, tens of thousands of millions, even billions, will perish.

Are you among the already rescued, among those men, women

and children who have the blessed fortune of having been snatched from impending spiritual death? Shall we sit on the shoreline of this sinking planet, thanking our Savior for our own salvation, bemoaning those still entrapped, but doing nothing for their rescue? How could we sleep at night were we to actually hear the anguished cries from a planet that loses two of its inhabitants to death every single second? “Wake up! Wake up, please!”

The bloody tree atop Calvary is a measure of the Love that loudly rejoices over every rescued soul, but mournfully weeps over every life unresponsive, reached too late. “Wake up! Wake up, please!”

While this school year now ends, the unfolding tragedy of this sinking, perishing planet does not. **“Rescue the perishing; don’t hesitate to step in and help. If you say, ‘Hey, that’s none of my business,’ will that get you off the hook? Someone is watching you closely, you know—Someone not impressed with weak excuses” (Proverbs 24:11, 12 The Message).** Wherever this summer journey takes us, I pray it will somehow immerse you and me in Christ’s rescue mission. Because the good news is that “Wake up! Wake up, please!” can come true, and the entrapped can wake up and be rescued while there still is time.

MUSIC ALIVE

FROM THE MATTHEW PASSION

The *Matthew Passion* by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) is both a narrative of events at the time of the death of Jesus Christ and a devotional commentary on those events. The composer drew on the biblical text by the disciple Matthew, along with commentary by the writer known by the name "Picander." The narrative typically is fast-paced and balanced by the highly-reflective pace of commentary. This is exemplified

in the vignette from disciple Peter's denial of Jesus. An additional element of response is the use of stanzas (melodies and texts both) from German hymns ("chorales"). In today's communion worship journey, we hear examples of all of these from choir, soloists and orchestra, the excerpts drawn from a contemporary-English rendering of items from the *Passion According to Matthew*.






