



BOUNTY OF BEAUTY AND BLESSING

"Out of God's bounty come beauty and blessing about which to "Bring Joy!" and "Give Thanks!" today. We share a hymn about God's creation, "All Things Bright and Beautiful."

Irish author Cecil Alexander (1818-1895) wished that children would understand beliefs stated in the catechism. In children's hymn texts, she rephrased and amplified various beliefs with special clarity for children. The subject of her hymn "All Things Bright and Beautiful" is, "I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth." Her text has a simple beauty transcending age, time, and place.

Ellen White says, "Nature and revelation alike testify of God's love. Our Father in heaven is the source of life, of wisdom, and of joy. Look at the wonderful and beautiful things of nature." (Steps to Christ) Today, "A Feast of Hymns" worship services begin with a musical look at nature, through varied musical reflections on "All Things Bright." The opening organ prelude and fugue stems from drafts by the organist written on a ranch in central British Columbia in 2022. Can you, with him, survey phenomenal flower cover on this

30-acre ranch, which that year seemed to have more than a hundred thousand blossoms including yellows, purples, and whites gracing a majestic rolling landscape?

Together, the prelude and fugue can be heard as expressing five contrasting aspects of God's creation in nature. The prelude weaves every hymn melody note into the musical fabric of the prelude's melody line, expressing a lucid calm. The fugue takes the beginning of the hymn melody's refrain and uses it as the fugue's "subject", which recurs typically with "counter subject" music in contrast to and complement with it. The fugue's four distinctive sections may be heard as speaking musically of nature evoking feelings and scenes of quiet joy, exuberant cheerfulness, soaring beauty, and towering strength.

Capping our exploration is the congregational singing of several of the hymn's stanzas.

Alexander's vivid language captures something significant of the sheer beauty and inspirational value of God's creation in nature...an invitation to "Bring Joy!" and "Give Thanks!" today!
