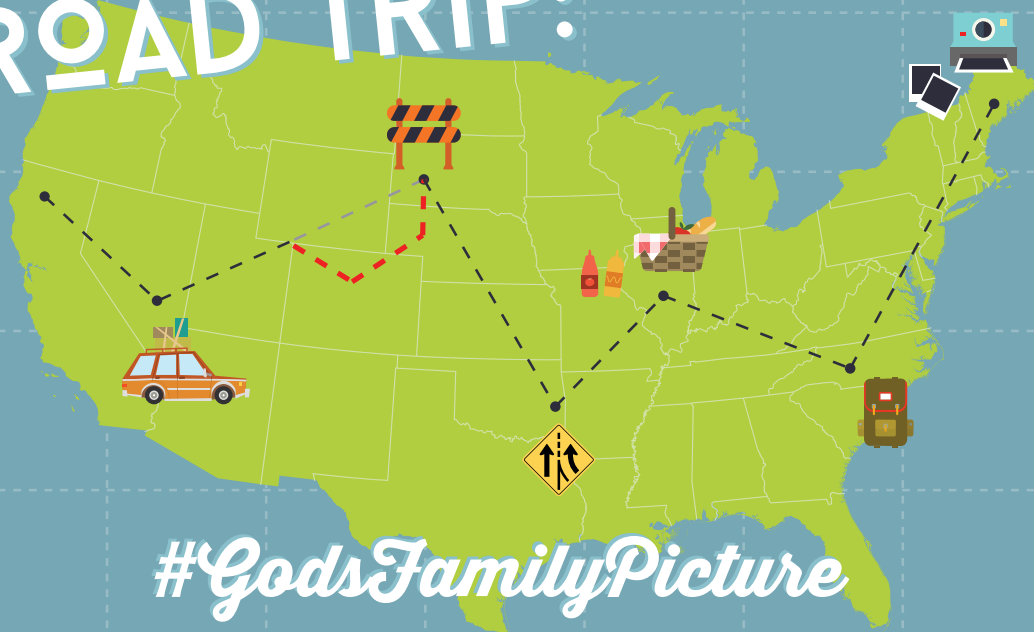

# GOD'S PICTURE OF FAMILY

*"Jacob, the Lord created you. Israel, he made you, and now he says, 'Don't be afraid. I saved you. I named you. You are mine.'" (Isaiah 43:1 ERV)*

**A** Craigslist ad caught the attention of our nation earlier this summer: You may have heard about Natalie Carson. Her ad read:

"College Student looking to rent a family for her birthday."

Nineteen-year-old Natalie had no family of her own since she had not been adopted out of the Foster Care system, so birthdays were especially painful. She worked part-time to help support her education, and could afford to pay eight dollars to a rented family so that, on her birthday, she could "feel like I matter, even if I don't."

What is your ideal picture of family?

During these past few months of our Summer Road Trip sermon series, we have explored God's Picture of Family. When Jesus pointed to His disciples, He called them: "my mother, my brothers" (Matthew 12:49).

The family that God builds is made up of people whose lives are centered on Jesus and the things Jesus does. Our relationship with Jesus takes precedence over all other relationships and shapes how we treat each other.

Each of our stories of faith and the circumstances that have brought us

together today are so varied but they tell one big story: We have been adopted and we belong to God. Natalie's story must have resonated with so many because people want to feel like they belong, even if just for a day.

## WHAT IS YOUR IDEAL PICTURE OF FAMILY?

The Bible says that God wants more for us: a lifetime of belonging to Him. He is planning a cosmic family party called "the marriage supper of the Lamb." All who are invited to this supper are called blessed (Revelation 19:6-9).

# STAY COOL

**T**he height of summer always raises quite a conundrum: How do I battle this humidity? Hot summer nights of tossing and turning make you question how our ancestors survived without air conditioning. According to the U.S. Energy Information Administration, the estimated average U.S. household electric bill in 2013 for June through August was \$395.

Living on the fourth floor in a two-bedroom apartment, I am always tempted to leave our small air-conditioner running all day and all night in order to battle the heat. I almost give in to temptation until I remember how quickly the numbers on my electricity bill rise the longer I leave the air-conditioner running. After searching the Internet profusely and asking everyone I know for advice, here is a list of things you can do to keep your home cool without harming your electricity bill.

## ❶ KEEP YOUR BLINDS CLOSED.

Although letting the sunlight into our homes can lift our spirits, we must note that up to 30 percent of unwanted heat comes from our windows, according to Family Handyman. By using shades, insulating curtains, or tinted window film on south or west windows, we can save up to 7 percent on our electric bills. Keep the blinds closed especially when the sun is directly pointing at your window.

## ❷ BE A PART OF THE FAN CLUB.

After taking a nice shower or cooking a warm meal, hot air tends to linger in the

air, making the house warmer than usual. Turn on the exhaust fans in your bathroom or kitchen after showering or cooking. According to U.S. News, the fans will pull the rising hot air out of your home.

Ceiling fans and electric fans tend to use less electricity than an air-conditioner. According to Energy Star, set your ceiling fan to rotate counter-clockwise, creating a wind-chill breeze effect that makes you feel cooler. As for electric fans, make sure the breeze hits you in its path to feel its cooling effects.

## ❸ TURN OFF THE ELECTRICITY.

Turn off the lights, especially incandescent light. Unplug any unused electronics, even those on standby. Most electronics produce and emit heat, contributing to the humidity that's already in the air.

## ❹ EAT COLD FOOD.

Ice cream would be a "definite" on the list, but there are healthy alternatives as well for cold food. Try a watermelon salad or cold soup. Fruits in the fridge are generally great choices for cold food and you will be able to get some water intake as well.

## ❺ GIVE IN AND GO OUTSIDE.

How about we stop fighting the humidity and find ways to enjoy it? Go to the beach. Take a stroll in the park. Sit outside and read.

If the humidity gets too much, then you can always give in and turn on the air-condi-



tioner. I know I have a few times. Sometimes it's just easier and better to give in to our modern-day technologies since that is what they have been invented for. Although the humidity can be a bit of a pain at times, let's enjoy the summer months, along with all the heat that it brings. Before we know it, Michigan winters will be upon us again and we will be reminiscing on how great it was when it was warm. ■

# MUSIC ALIVE

## STILL "GOLDEN," BUT WITH DIFFERENT WORDS

**O**ften mentioned in this column has been the hymntune AURELIA. Its meaning, "magnificent" or "splendid" from the word "aurea" ("golden"), also has been mentioned often. However, today we pair this melody with words that, in likelihood, are less-often heard with it. This is not with Samuel Stone's text "The Church Has One Foundation," but rather is with Frances Ridley

Havergal's "Live Out Thy Life Within Me." Havergal (1836-1879) was born into an English Anglican family. Her father was a clergyman who wrote hymns, and her brother was an organist. Not blessed with reliably good health, she died in Wales at age 42 of peritonitis. Havergal also wrote the words for the widely known hymns "Take My Life, and Let It Be Consecrated" and "I Gave My Life for Thee." ■
