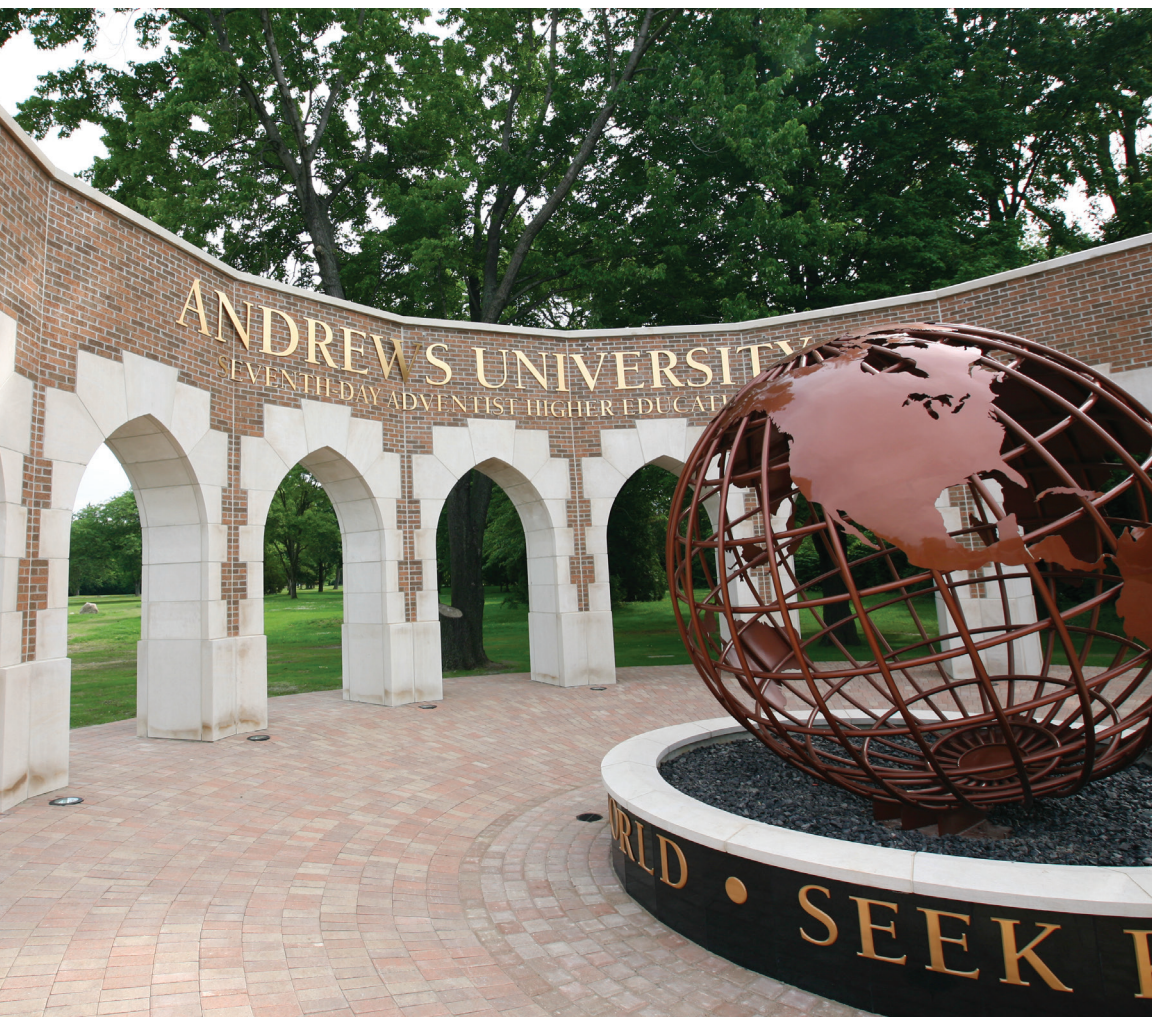

MUSIC ALIVE

JOYFUL TWICE OVER

It is among the more widely-known of hymn melodies. Today's Hymn of Praise, "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee" has a melody adapted from Ludwig van Beethoven's Ninth Symphony. There its text is the so-called "Ode to Joy." In Beethoven's work, the melody is introduced in a most-interesting way. In the symphony, Beethoven already has introduced a variety of musical themes. As an introduction to this climactic melody that in

its development concludes this colossal symphony, Beethoven reintroduces—and rejects—various fragments of what has come before. Then the hymn-prototype melody enters in majestic quietude, eventually rising to an almost feverish pitch of jubilation. Could be like joy in our lives, couldn't it, on this commencement weekend—entering unassumingly, expanding exponentially over time? ■

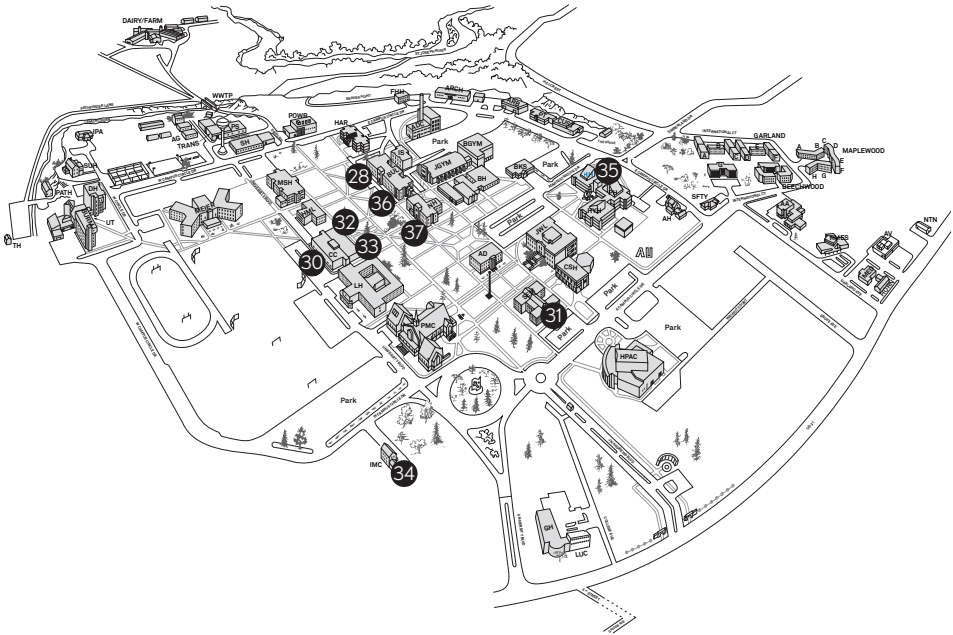
