
WELCOME to Piqueer

As we sing praises, bring our tithes and offerings, and join our hearts in prayer, may this day be our most important appointment of all the weekour special appointment with our Creator.



ANDREWS ACADEMY Students in Jordan

ne of the unique features of Andrews Academy (AA) is its partnership with Andrews University (AU). Academy students can take college classes their junior or senior year with some classes as duel credit. We often have university professors make presentations at the academy. This summer seven Andrews Academy students joined the AU archaeological dig in Jordan.

Each summer AU's archaeological department continues a dig at two different sites in Jordan. Students leave their hotel at 4 or 5 AM, before the heat of the day, to begin digging and sifting through to find pottery. They return during the heat of the day for pottery washing so the next day it can be "read." This is where everyone is taught forms and periods and where much of what they did at the site gains meaning.

On the weekends they go on educational tours of Jordan. Locations such as the Dead Sea, the Jordan River, Machaerus (a fortress Herod the Great had built in 30 BC and where John the Baptist was beheaded about 60 years later by another Herod), Moabite stone, and many other locations. Their first Friday evening vespers was at Mount Nebo Memorial of Moses.

The Archaeologists hotel has a pool to cool off in after a busy day of work (shown in the picture on the left). They also go into the village in the evening. In the picture below they are drinking tea with grandpa Yusef ("Joseph"), a local shop owner who is greatly loved by the dig team.

It's an amazing experience for Andrews Academy students to see the Biblical sites so the stories in the Bible can come alive and provide deeper meaning and insight.

MUSIC ALIVE "COMMUNITY IN HIM"

The hymn "In Christ There Is No East nor West" underlies today's closing music. The text, in hymn no. 587, stems from a missionary pageant in London. The writer of the libretto for the pageant, William Arthur Dunkerley, wrote this hymn text. One commentary states, "The theme of the hymn reflects the apostle Paul's statement: 'There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ye are all one in Christ Jesus' (Gal. 3:28)." Christ said, "Blessed are the peacemakers ... " The final stanza of the hymn says, "In Christ now meet both east and west, / In Him meet south and north; / All Christly souls are one in Him / Throughout the whole wide world." ■




MASTER PLAN OF EVANGELISM
